CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5

Proposed by the 82nd General Assembly (Second Regular Session)

Permits legislative authority to set certain standards. Provides for division of funds received. There shall be no cost to the state or its political subdivisions as all expenses shall be paid from revenue derived from the proceeds.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 7

Proposed by Initiative Petition

Prohibits pari-mutuel wagering on horse racing. Creates Missouri Horse Racing Commission; creates special fund to Commission, certain programs, horse research, and other purposes. Provides that voters of each county shall determine by referendum whether pari-mutuel wagering shall be permitted. The cost of the referendum shall be borne by state until the referendum is realized. The cost of the referendum shall range from \$30 million per year until the referendum is realized. The referendum shall be held on the next general election after the referendum is realized.
