Court Order - 1-12-12-01 -

Court Orders through. ORDER 1-12-12-01 ORDER REGARDING EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT FOR CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI

WHEREAS, the Missouri Revised Statutes Chapter 44.080 gives authority for organization of local emergency management agencies to be organized and perform emergency management functions; and

WHEREAS, to protect the health and safety of persons and property during an emergency or disaster resulting from man-made or natural causes.

There is hereby created within and for the territory of Christian County, Missouri, an emergency management agency to be known as the Christian County Office of Emergency Management.

Section 1. Regulations Continued in Effect

All ordinances, resolutions, motions, and orders pertaining to civil defense, emergency management, and disaster relief, which are not in conflict with this chapter, are continued in full force and effect. Such ordinances, etc., are on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Section 2. Emergency Management and Response Powers

- 1) Departmental Standards
- A) Functions of the Office of Emergency Management, The Christian County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) shall perform emergency management functions as directed by local procedural standards, orders, and ordinances as directed by the County Commission.
- B) Membership of the Office of Emergency Management. The Christian County OEM shall consist of a director and additional members sufficient to carry out departmental duties. These additional members will be appointed by the director.
- C) Oath. No person shall be employed or associated, in any capacity, with the Christian County OEM who advocates or has advocated a change by force or violence in the constitutional form of the government of the United States or in this state or the overthrow of any government in the United States by force or violence. No person shall be employed or associated with the Christian County OEM who has been convicted of or is under indictment or information charging any subversive act against the United States. Each person who is appointed to serve in a capacity with the Christian County OEM shall, before entering upon his/her duties, take an oath, in writing, before the Clerk of Christian County. The oath shall be substantially as follows:

I _______ do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Missouri, against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter. And I do further swear (or affirm) that I do not advocate, nor am I a member of a political party or organization that advocates the overthrow of the government of the United States or of this state by force or violence; and that during such a time as I am a member of the Christian County Office of Emergency Management, I will not advocate the overthrow of the government of the United States or of this state by force or violence.

D) Appointment and Duties of the Emergency Management Director. The Director of the Christian County OEM will be appointed by the Christian County Commission. Duties of the Director include, but are not limited to:

will be appointed by the Christian County Commission. Duties of the Director include, but are not limited to:

- Coordinate daily community mitigation and preparedness activities, localized emergency response activities, recovery coordination efforts, and the participation in regional emergency management activities.
- 2) Direct responsibility for the organization, administration, and operation of all local emergency management activities and coordination of those activities with all county departments.
- 3) Develop and promulgate emergency plans for the County, including planning for joint action with municipalities consistent with the state plan of emergency management.
- 4) Coordinate and assist in the development of joint action municipal emergency management plans within the County and integrate such plans with the County plan.
- 5) Direct the County and joint action municipality emergency management planning programs.
- 6) Coordinate the County and joint action municipalities emergency actions and coordinate the non-joint action municipal emergency actions within the County.
- Maintain all relevant disaster preparedness planning documents for the community.
- 8) Activate the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), as deemed necessary for the community-wide coordination of resources in the event of a threatened or actual incident.
- Maintain continual state of readiness of the central disaster community coordination center known as the Emergency Operations Center (EOC).
- 10) Activate the EOC as deemed necessary for the community-wide coordination of resource in the event of a threatened or actual incident.
- 11) Maintain liaison and cooperate with emergency management agencies and organizations both governmental and non-governmental in other cities, counties, states, and the federal government.
- 12) Maintain records and the accounting for the use and disposal of all equipment placed under the jurisdiction of the Christian County OEM.
- 13) Maintain records and the accounting of grants placed under the jurisdiction of the Christian County OEM.
- 14) Serve as the County Coordinator for implementation of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), which is the federal system to coordinate emergency preparedness and response for all levels of government.
- 15) Perform such other duties related to emergency management as may be required by the Christian County Commission or any municipality acting under a joint action municipal emergency management ordinance which has appointed the County's emergency management director as its Director of Emergency Management.
- E) Declaration of Local Emergency
- 1) Grant of Authority. In the event of a threatened or actual disaster or emergency, which may result in the large-scale loss of life, injury, property damage or destruction, or major disruption of the routine community affairs, businesses, or governmental operations in Christian County, and which is sufficient in severity and magnitude to warrant extraordinary assistance by federal, state, and/or local departments and agencies to supplement the efforts of available public and private resources the Presiding Commissioner or designee may declare a local emergency for Christian County, Missouri. The form of the declaration shall be similar to that provided in subsection (2C) of this document.
- 2) Commission Line of Succession. In the event that the Presiding Commissioner is unavailable or incapacitated by the emergency event, the Associate Commissioners, in order of seniority, shall serve as the designee. If both Associate Commissioners are available, the declaration will be made in concurrence from both Associate Commissioners. If there are no Commissioners available to make a local emergency declaration, the responsibility will be that of the Sheriff. If there are no Commissioners or Sheriff available to make a local emergency declaration, then the responsibility will be that of the Director of the Christian County Office of Emergency Management.
- Request for State Assistance. Consistent with a declaration of local emergency, the Presiding Commissioner
 or designee may request the Governor to provide assistance. This may be done provided the disaster or

emergency is beyond the capacity of the County to adequately meet and State assistance is necessary to supplement local efforts to save lives and protect property, public health and safety, or to avert or lessen the threat of a disaster.

- 4) Continuance. The declaration of local emergency shall continue until the Presiding Commissioner or designee finds that emergency conditions no longer exist. No state of local emergency shall continue for longer than 30 days, unless renewed by the Presiding Commissioner or designee. The County Commission may end a state of local emergency at any time.
- 5) Effect of Declaration of Local Emergency
- (a) County Business. Upon declaration of an emergency or disaster by the Presiding Commissioner, the affairs and business of the county may be conducted at places other than the regular location, when it is not prudent, expedient, or possible to conduct business at the regular location.

 In accordance with Missouri Revised Statutes 610.020, if the incident prevents posting notice 24 hours in advance or prevents the meeting from being held at a convenient time or in a place reasonably accessible to the public, the reasons should be stated in the meeting's minutes. When such meetings occur, all actions taken by the County Commission shall be as valid and binding as if performed at or during regular proceedings. Such meetings may be called by the Presiding Commissioner or any two members of the County Commission.
- (b) Purchasing. Upon declaration of an emergency and in accordance with Missouri Revised Statute 50.780, the County Commission may waive the requirement of competitive bid or proposals for supplies when immediate expenditure is necessary. Emergency procurements shall be made with as much competition as practicable during the emergency incident. As soon as possible, a record of each emergency procurement shall be made and include the contractor's name, the amount and type of the contract, and a listing of the item(s) procured under the contract.
- (c) Code Enforcement. Upon declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the Presiding Commissioner, the County Commission may temporarily suspend the enforcement of the orders of the county, or any portion thereof, where the emergency is of such nature that immediate action outside the code is required, such suspension is consistent with the protection of the public health, safety and welfare, and such suspension is not contradictory with any deferral or state statutes or regulations.
- (d) Fees. Upon declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the Presiding Commissioner, the County Commission may temporarily reduce or suspend any permit fees, application fees, or other rate structures as necessary to encourage the rebuilding of the areas impacted by the disaster or emergency. The term "fees" include fees or rates charged by the county for building permits, land disturbance permits, zoning applications, special land use permits, temporary land use permits, and other fees relating to the reconstruction, repair, and clean up the areas impacted by the disaster or emergency. The term "fees" does not include fees collected by the county on behalf of the state or federal government of fees charged by the county pursuant to a state or federal statute or regulation.
- (e) Temporary Dwellings. Upon the declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the Presiding Commissioner, the county or its designees may issue temporary permits for a mobile home, trailer, recreational vehicle, or other temporary dwelling structures in any zoning district, even though not otherwise permitted by county regulations, while the primary dwelling is being repaired. The temporary permit shall not exceed six months in duration. Upon expiration of the temporary permit and/or extension, the temporary dwelling must be removed.
- (f) Emergency Management Director. Following a declaration of emergency, the Emergency Management Director or designee is authorized to have and may exercise for such period as the declared emergency exists or continues, the following additional emergency powers:
- Coordinate the County and joint action Municipalities emergency actions and coordinate the non-joint action municipal emergency actions within the County.
- To implement local emergency measure which protect life and property or to bring the emergency situation
 under control. In exercising this authority, the Emergency Management Director or designee may cause to become
 effective the authorities of this order as appropriate.
- To activate the local EOP and shall be the authority for the deployment of personnel and use of any forces to
 which the plan applies and for use or distribution of any supplies, equipment, materials, and facilities assembled,
 stockpiled, or arranged to be made available pursuant to Chapter 44, RSMo., or any other laws, orders, or
 ordinances applicable to emergencies or disasters.
- To enter at a reasonable time upon any property, for the purpose of damage assessment and inspecting sites involved in or damaged by a declared disaster.

- To arrange agreements to use property for the purposes of emergency management activities on behalf of the County; however, any such document shall be later presented for ratification by the County Commission.
- To direct and compel the evacuation of all or part of the population from any stricken or threatened area, for the preservation of life or other disaster mitigation, response, or recovery.
- To prescribe routes, modes of transportation, and destinations in connections with evacuation.
- To make provision for the availability and use of temporary emergency housing, emergency shelters, and/or emergency medical shelters.
- To transfer the direction, personnel, or functions of any county departments and agencies, or units thereof, for the purpose of performing or facilitating emergency services.
- To utilize all available resources of the county and subordinate agencies over which the county has budgetary control as reasonably necessary to cope with the emergency or disaster.
- To obtain or utilize public or private property when necessary to cope with the emergency or disaster of when there is compelling necessity for the protection of lives, health and welfare, and/or the property of citizens.
- To suspend any order, code provision, or regulation prescribing the procedures for conduct of county business, or the orders, rules, or regulations of any county agency, if strict compliance with any ordinance, resolution, order, rule, or regulation would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency or disaster, provided that such suspension shall provide for the minimum deviation from the requirements under the circumstances and further provided that, when possible, specialists shall be assigned to avoid adverse effects resulting from such suspension.
- To provide welfare benefits to citizens upon execution of an intergovernmental agreement for grants to meet
 disaster-related, necessary expenses or serious needs of individuals or families adversely affected by an
 emergency or disaster in cases where the individuals or families are unable to meet the expenses or needs from
 other means, provided that such grants are authorized only when matching state or federal funds are available for
 such purposes.
- To perform and exercise such other functions, powers, and duties as may be deemed necessary to promote
 and secure the safety and protection of the civilian population, including individuals with household pets and
 service animals prior to, during, and following a major disaster of emergency.

II) Form of Declaration

Upon the declaration of local emergency, an official "Declaration of Local Emergency," in substantially the same form set forth below, shall be signed and filed in the office of the County Clerk and shall be communicated to the citizens of the affected area using the most effective and efficient means available. The Declaration shall state the nature of the emergency or disaster and the conditions that require the Declaration.

DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the County of Christian, State of Missouri has experienced an event of critical significance as a result of [Description of Event] on [Date]; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Presiding Commissioner of the County of Christian, there exists emergency circumstances located in [Describe Geographic Location] requiring extraordinary and immediate corrective actions for the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County of Christian, including individuals with household pets and service animals; and

WHEREAS, to prevent or minimize injury to people and damage to property resulting from this event.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1) That the local Emergency Operations Plan is hereby activated;
- 2) That all necessary sections of the County of Christian Emergency Management Order will be implemented;

3) That the following measures also be implemented: [If deemed appropriate, add items.]

III) Contracts with Local Government

In addition to the normal agreements embodied in the local EOP for mutual emergency assistance, municipalities within Christian County may adopt joint action emergency management ordinances for the administration of a joint action emergency plan and response with Christian County's Office of Emergency Management.

Section 3. Closed or Restricted Areas and Curfews During an Emergency

- I) To preserve, protect, and sustain the life, health, welfare, or safety of persons, or their property, within a designated area under a declaration of emergency, it shall be unlawful for any person to travel, loiter, wander, or stroll in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, lanes, parks, or other public grounds, public places, public buildings, places of amusement, eating places, vacant lots, or any other place during a declared emergency between hours specified by the Presiding Commissioner until curfew is lifted.
- II) To promote order, protect lives, minimized the potential for looting and other crimes, and facilitate recovery operations during an emergency, the Presiding Commissioner shall have discretion to impose re-entry restrictions on certain areas. The Presiding Commissioner shall exercise such discretion in accordance with the local EOP, which shall be followed during emergencies.
- III) The provisions of the section shall not apply to persons acting in the following capacities:
- A) Authorized and essential law enforcement personnel;
- B) Authorized and essential health care providers;
- C) Authorized and essential personnel of the County as approved by the County Commission or Emergency Management Director;
- D) Authorized National Guard or federal military personnel;
- E) Authorized and essential firefighters;
- F) Authorized and essential emergency response personnel;
- G) Authorized and essential personnel or volunteers working with or through an Emergency Management Agency;
- H) Authorized and essential utility repair crews;
- Other authorized and essential persons as designated on a list compiled by the Christian County OEM.

Section 4. Special Events

i) Definition

Special events are defined as an event, or series of related events, of cultural, civic, economic, social, recreational, or educational in nature, sponsored by an individual or individuals, a non-profit organization or community group, charitable organization of for-profit organization or group, that is (1) held wholly or partially on property owned or maintained by the County; or (2) held on any other property, and that requires, for its successful execution, the partial or complete closure of streets of sidewalks or the provision and coordination of government services to a degree over and above the level that the County normally provides. Special events also include any other organized activity that involves the use of, or has a direct or indirect impact on, public property or facilities or that can reasonably be foreseen to have such an impact on, or to require a higher level of public safety services or

II) Authority of the Office of Emergency Management

Any special event, as defined above, shall require the OEM to conduct an evaluation of the need for coordinated planning and the potential for on-site public safety coordination operations during such and event organizational authority is mandated to participate and utilize the following:

- A) Pre-event planning, to include but not limited to meetings and planning sessions.
- B) On-site public safety resource coordination during the duration of the event as determined by the pre-event planning process.
- C) Post-event after action planning.
- III) Funding Reimbursement

All activities related to planning, coordination, and response to the special event may be changed (using established departmental cost specifications) to the event organizational authority to be reimbursed to appropriate Christian County departmental budgets.

Section 5. Registration of Building and Repair Services

In accordance with County regulations, before building, constructing, repairing, renovating, or making improvements to any real property, including dwellings, homes, buildings, structures, or fixtures within an area in the county designated in a declared emergency or disaster, any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity must follow County protocols and regulations.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that is this document shall become effective upon its approval.

Mr. Powell said there is nothing that is changing the food code that is not in force today. Food that is prepared for a church bake sale should have a sign posted that says "prepared in a private home kitchen".

2011 County Food Code CHRISTIAN COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT AN ORDER REGULATING THE OPERATION OF FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES IN THE COUNTY OF CHRISTIAN, STATE OF MISSOURI

An order governing the operation of food establishments within Christian County requiring certain permits for operations and providing penalties thereof.

It is hereby ordered by the Christian County Health Department Board of Trustees and the Christian County Commission as follows:

Authority: Section 192.300, RSMo 1986. The county commissions and the county health center boards of the several counties may make and promulgate orders, ordinances, rules or regulations, respectively as will tend to enhance the public health and prevent the entrance of infectious, contagious, communicable or dangerous diseases into such county, but an orders, ordinances, rules or regulations shall not be in conflict with any rules or regulations authorized and made by the department of health in accordance with this chapter or by the department of social services under Chapter 198, RSMo. The county commission and the county health center board of trustees may establish reasonable fees to pay for any costs incurred in carrying out such orders, ordinances, rules or regulations, however, the establishment of such fees shall not deny the personal health services to those individuals who are unable to pay such fees or impede the prevention or control of communicable disease.

Section 1: Definitions

1.1 As used in this order the following words and phrases have the following meaning:

January 30, 2012 2

- A) Code: Is the most recently adopted Food Code by the Christian County Health Department Board of Trustees and is based on the current Missouri Food Code as adopted by state statute, which is based on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Public Health Service, Food and Drug Administration Food Code.
 - B) Department: The Christian County Health Department
- C) Food Establishment: An operation as defined in the Code as a food establishment and excludes operations defined in the code as "not a food establishment".

"Temporary food establishment" means a food establishment that operates for a period of no more than 14 consecutive days in conjunction with a single event or celebration.

"Seasonal food establishment" is an establishment that serves, prepares or provides food at the retail level for a time period of not more than 4 months. A seasonal food establishment does not have to be associated with an event. A seasonal food establishment must meet the requirements of the code.

"Not a Food Establishment" In addition to the definition found in the code, the following are defined as not meeting the definition of a food establishment.

Churches or other non-profit organizations where the food service is limited to members and their guests and there is no charge to dine. Diners must be informed by a clearly visible placard that the food is prepared in a kitchen that is not subject to regulation and inspection by the department.

Food establishments and food processing facilities that are routinely inspected by the FDA, USDA, Division of Aging, Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services, Missouri Department of Agriculture, or other federal or state regulatory agency having jurisdiction over those types of establishments are not considered "Food Establishments" for regulation under the code unless retail food sales/ service are conducted.

- D) Health Officer: The Administrator of the Christian County Health Department or an authorized representative.
- E) Imminent Health Hazard: Means a significant threat or danger to health. This is considered to exist when there is evidence sufficient to show that a product, practice, circumstance, or event creates a situation that requires immediate correction or cessation of operation to prevent injury.
- F) Permit: A written authorization issued by the Christian County Health Department which authorizes a person to operate a food establishment, temporary food establishment or seasonal food establishment.
- G) Raw Dairy Products: Means any dairy product that is not pasteurized or does not undergo some other type of process approved in the current FDA Grade A Pasteurized Milk Ordinance to remove infectious agents.
- H) Remodel: Means construction, conversion, or modifications which involve changing the location, replacement, or installation of major plumbing fixtures and food equipment and/or food contact surfaces of counters and/or the construction or replacement of walls, floors, and ceilings in food preparation areas.
- Work Order: A form used in the enforcement process when an establishment has failed two concurrent reinspections, an Imminent Health Hazard exists or the stipulations identified under Section 9, Automatic Closure have been met. This document is a bridge between voluntary compliance and compulsory compliance through legal action.
- 1.2 All other definitions as listed in the Food Code of the United States Public Health Service Food and Drug Administration most recently adopted by the Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services and the Christian County Health Department Board of Trustees by reference.

Section 2: Adoption

The Christian County Commission hereby adopts the State standard as defined in Missouri Laws accompanied by Department of Health and Senior Services Rules governing Food Establishments and 19 CSR 20-1.023 Sanitation of Food Establishments with the following exceptions:

2.01 All Food Establishments shall be required to obtain an operating permit from the Department.

2.02 Permits may be revoked or suspended by the Department. Reason for suspension or revocation may include

violation of the food order or code, scoring a 60 or less with 6 critical violations on a routine inspection or creating an imminent threat to the public. This may include failure to correct items listed on the work order or during time frame given by the authorized representative, failure to properly obtain operating permit, not removing employees who have a disease or medical issue that may cause a communicable disease outbreak, or does not have the proper physical facilities or equipment to operate a food establishment.

- 2.03 Any food establishment that has failed to correct repeat critical violations noted on two consecutive follow-up inspections or complaint inspection shall be issued a work order. The correction time on a work order shall be no more than thirty (30) days. If the issues noted on the work order are not corrected in the time given then the operating permit will be suspended or revoked.
- 2.04 Any food establishment that has had its permit revoked or suspended will be closed for business until the condition leading to the closure has been corrected. The food establishment will provide 24 hours notice for the Department to schedule the inspection. Once the department has inspected and verified that corrections have been made, approval may be granted by the department for the establishment to reopen for business. Also reference section 9.2 for food handlers training.
- 2.05 Raw dairy products shall not be sold and/or served, nor orders taken for, at food establishments except as outlined in 2.05 (A), (B) and (C)...
- A) Grade A raw milk and dairy products may be sold and delivered by person(s) possession a Grade A retail raw milk permit from the State Milk Board and a food permit from the department, and the seller is the individual actually producing the food or an immediate family member residing in the producers household and having extensive knowledge of the process and production of the food.
- B) A placard is prominently visible at the point of sale stating "WARNING Raw (unpasteurized) milk and raw milk dairy products may contain disease-causing microorganisms. Persons at highest risk of disease from these organisms include newborns and infants, the elderly, pregnant women, those taking corticosteroids, antibiotics or antacids, and those having chronic illnesses or other conditions that weaken their immunity." A minimum size of 8.5"X11".
- C) The code shall be applied to the sale and delivery of Grade A Retail raw milk and dairy products. This includes, but is not limited to, physical facilities, temperature controls for transportation and sale, labeling and consumer advisories, food handlers training and all other applicable sections of the code. The consumer advisory will state, "WARNING": Raw (unpasteurized) milk and raw milk dairy products may contain disease-causing microorganisms. Persons at highest risk of disease from these organisms include newborns and infants, the elderly, pregnant women, those taking corticosteroids, antibiotics or antacids, and those having chronic illnesses or other conditions that weaken their immunity." And be affixed to the product container..
- D) Producers of retail raw dairy products may sell and take orders for their product at the physical farm location where the products are produced and may deliver the product to the clients domicile.

The processing of raw dairy products shall be referred to the rules and regulations administered and enforced by the Missouri Department of Agriculture and/or the Missouri Milk Board except as provided in this order. 2.06 Abatement orders shall be delivered in person or by certified mail and shall be served to the owner, operator, or person-in-charge.

- 2.07 All mobile food units shall be required to meet the requirements of the food code. If the mobile food unit is a pushcart then the owner or operator will need to have a structure to store the unit. The physical facility shall meet all of the requirements of the food code.
- 2.08 All new food establishments or establishments undergoing a remodel or transfer of ownership shall be required to complete a plan review and have an approved pre-opening inspection before an operating permit is issued by the Department.
- 2.9 Operating permits shall be posted in such a manner so that the permit may be viewed by the public.
- 2.10 Owners, operators, managers, and/or the person-in-charge shall be required to attend an approved food safety program at least every two years.
- 2.11 Facilities that require more than two re-inspections following a routine or complaint inspection may be charged a re-inspection fee.
- 2.12 Facilities that are thirty (30) days past the due date on the submittal of operating permit fees may be charged a late fee.

Section 3: Permit Applications

3.1 Requirements: A person may not operate a food establishment, temporary food establishment or seasonal

food establishment without a valid permit to operate issued by the department.

3.2 Applications:

- A) An applicant shall submit an application for permit in a timely manner before the date planned for opening a food establishment or the expiration date of the current permit for an existing establishment.
- B) A person desiring to operate a food establishment shall submit to the department a written application for a permit on a form provided by the department.
 - C) The application shall include:
- 1) The name, address, telephone number and signature of the person applying for the permit and the name, mailing address and location of the food establishment.
- 2) Information specifying whether the establishment is owned by an association, corporation, individual, partnership, or other legal entity.
- 3) A statement signed by the applicant that attests to the accuracy of the information provided in the application.
 - 4) A statement specifying the type of operation.
 - 5) The foods offered, the source of the food and type and location of preparation.

Section 4: Issuance of Permits

4.1 New, Converted, or Remodeled Establishments:

The department shall issue a permit to the applicant after:

- A) A properly completed application is submitted.
- B) The required fee is submitted.
- C) The required plans, specifications, and other specific information as requested to demonstrate conformance with code provisions are reviewed and approved.
- D) Approval from the appropriate regulatory agencies. (For example: County Planning and Zoning and City Building Regulations, Missouri Department of Natural Resources)
- E) A preoperational inspection showing that the establishment is built or remodeled in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and that the establishment is in compliance with the code and this order.
- 4.2 Existing Establishments, Permit Renewal, and Change of Ownership:

The department may renew a permit for an existing food establishment or may issue a permit to a new owner of an existing food establishment after a properly completed application is submitted, reviewed, and approved, the fees are paid, and an inspection shows that the establishment is in compliance with the code and this order.

4.3 Temporary Food Establishments: The department shall issue a permit for a temporary food establishment after a properly completed application is submitted, reviewed and approved and any required fees are paid.

Seasonal Food Establishments: The department shall issue a permit for a seasonal food establishment after a properly completed application is submitted, reviewed and approved and any required fees are paid. At the discretion of the department a plan review may be required along with a pre-operation inspection.

4.4 Permits Not Transferable:

A permit may not be transferred from one person to another person, from one food establishment to another, or from one type of operation to another.

4.5 Denial of Application for Permit, Notice:

If an application for a permit to operate is denied, the department shall provide the applicant with a notice that

includes:

- A) The specific reasons and Code violations for the permit denial.
- B) The actions, if any, that the applicant must take to qualify for a permit.
- C) Advisement of the applicant's right of appeal and the process and time frames for appeal that are provided for under this order.
- 4.6 A permit issued pursuant to this order shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issuance.

4.7 Permit Fees:

Inspection fees shall be collected for each permit issued. Training fees shall be collected for each training session, and fees shall be collected for additional training material as necessary. The amount of these fees shall not be more than the cost of administrating this ordinance.

Section 5: Responsibilities of the Permit Holder

- 5.1 Upon acceptance of the permit issued by the department, the permit holder in order to retain the permit shall:
- A) Post the permit in a location in the facility that is conspicuous to consumers.
- B) Comply with the provisions of the regulations, rules, and orders of the department and shall operate the establishment in accordance to this ordinance including the conditions of any granted variance and approved plans as specified in this ordinance.
- Sign the acknowledgment of receipt of inspection findings.
- D) Immediately contact the department to report a communicable illness of an applicant or employee as specified in the code.
- E) Immediately discontinue operations and notify the department if an imminent health hazard may exist.
- F) Comply with directives of the department including time frames for corrective actions specified in inspection reports, notices, orders, warnings, and other directives issued by the department in regard to the permit holder's food establishment or in response to community emergencies.
- G) Accept notices issued and served by the department according to this ordinance.
- H) The permit holder shall be the person in charge or shall designate such a person and shall assure that a person in charge is present at the food establishment during all hours of food preparation, service, sales, transportation or other such types of food handling.
- I) Trained food handlers. The food establishment must have at least one trained food handler per shift of operation. Food handler training may be either through a nationally accredited program as defined in the code, or through compliance with the Department's food handler training curriculum.
- J) Allow representatives of the Department, bearing proper credentials and identification, access to the food establishment for the purpose of inspection and investigation in accordance with this ordinance

Section 6: Responsibilities of the Department

6.1 At the time the initial permit is issued to a food establishment, the department shall provide to the permit holder one copy of the code and the order so the permit holder is notified of the compliance requirements and the conditions of retention.

Section 7: Inspections

7.1 All inspections shall be conducted by an Environmental Public Health Specialist or other designated employee of the Christian County Health Department. The department shall inspect a food establishment at least annually. Frequency of complaint and compliance inspections will be determined by the department.

Section 8: Restriction or Exclusion From Food Handling

8.1 Any food handler who tests positive for a communicable disease identified in the code as reportable, shall be restricted or excluded from a food handling procedure until the disease is no longer in the communicable stage. The determination that the communicable stage has lapsed shall be confirmed by the nursing staff of the department in accordance with Missouri Department of Health's "Communicable Disease Manual" and the code. The Department's nursing staff may consult with the Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services, at their discretion.

Section 9: Automatic Closure

9.1 Any food establishment that scores 60 or less and has at least 6 critical items marked on the inspection sheet shall automatically and immediately cease operations until such time as the critical items are determined, by re-inspection, to be corrected.

A re-inspection will occur on the mutually agreed upon date, but no sooner than after the establishment has provided 24 hours notice.

A permit holder shall immediately discontinue operations and notify the regulatory authority if an imminent health hazard may exist because of an emergency such as a fire, flood, extended interruption of electrical or water service, sewage backup, misuse of poisonous or toxic materials, onset of an apparent food borne illness outbreak, gross unsanitary occurrence or condition, or other circumstances that may endanger public health. The establishment shall also be closed immediately in the event an imminent health hazard is determined during any inspection being performed by a Christian County Health Department Environmental Public Health Specialist.

9.2 The permit holder for a food establishment that is served an automatic closure order shall renew their basic food handlers training or obtain certification from an accredited program as defined in the code.

Section 10: Penalties

- 10.1 Any person found to be violating any provision of this order shall be served by the Department with a written notice, via certified mail, or in person, stating the nature of the violation and providing a reasonable time limit for the satisfactory correction thereof. The offender shall, within the period of time stated in such notice, permanently cease all violation.
- 10.2 Any person who continues a violation beyond the time limit provided for in Section 9.1, shall be guilty of an infraction and upon conviction thereof shall be assessed an administrative penalty in an amount not exceeding Two Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$200.00) per day for each violation. Each day in which any such violation does continue shall be deemed a separate offense.
- 10.3 The Christian County Health Department may issue an "Order to Abate" based on a condition that may transmit, generate, or promote disease. Failure on the part of the person to comply with the Order could result in the enforcement of the Order in the court of jurisdiction by the initiation of an action by the county attorney or county prosecuting attorney.
- 10.4 Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall become liable to the Department for any expense, loss or damage incurred by the Department by reason of such violation.

Section 11: Appeals

- 11.01 Any person(s) aggrieved by any decision or order(s) issued by the Director of the Department may appeal to the Board of Trustees of the Department by filling a written application with the Health Officer within thirty (30) days after such decision or order is issued which is the subject of the appeal.
- 11.02 Upon the Health Officer's receipt of such request, the Board of Trustees of the Department shall hear the matter in an open hearing after at least five (5) days written notice of the time, place and nature thereof. The time shall be measured pursuant to the Missouri Rules of Civil Procedure. (A shorter period of time may be granted, if requested by either party and agreed upon.)
- 11.03 The Notice of the hearing shall be served upon the person requesting the review by hand delivering or

mailing by certified mail the Notice to the address the person shall designate in the letter of request for an appeal to the Department's Board of Trustees.

11.04 The Board of Trustees of the Department shall conduct an appeal hearing in accordance with the Board of Trustee's adopted rules and procedures. The Board of Trustees shall make written findings of fact and shall enter its final order of determination in the matter in writing. The Board of Trustees' Order completes the administrative appeals procedure.

Section 12: Jurisdiction

The regulations contained in this ordinance shall be applicable to all food establishments located in unincorporated areas of Christian County, Missouri. This order shall also apply to food establishments located in incorporated cities or areas of Christian County not maintaining an organized health department and do not have inspection contract(s) with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

Section 13: Effective Date

This order shall become effective on that date that it is acted upon and ordered by the Christian County Commission.

Section 14: Severability

14.1 If any section, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this order.

WHEREAS, §211.160, RSMo allows for the imprisonment costs of any prisoner to be assessed and paid in the same manner as other costs of criminal prosecution are directed to be paid; and

NOW, THEREFORE, on this 6th day of February, 2012, at a meeting duly called of the Christian County Commission, upon motion made by Commissioner Bill Barnett, seconded by Commissioner Lou Lapaglia, with Commissioner Tom Huff being absent, the Christian County Commission did vote yes, to enact the following Order:

Section 1. Title. This Order shall be known as the Per Diem Cost of Incarceration Order.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this Order is to set the per diem cost of incarceration of prisoners confined in the Christian County Jail for purpose of reimbursement by the State of Missouri for the cost of incarceration as well as for assessing the cost of incarceration upon prisoners confined in the Christian County Jail upon release after a plea or finding of guilt.

Section 3. Definitions.

The meeting was attended by Sheriff Kyle, Assessor David Stokely, Auditor Sam Yarnell, Captain Brian Cathey, Recorder Kelly Hall, Public Administrator Ken Davis and Treasurer Karen Matthews.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Tyler Moles from P.C. Net to discuss email archival and web filtering. Mr. Tyler said that they have a process where all emails are archived and are deleted when they reach five years old. This archival process ensures that any emails that would be requested through a Sunshine Law request would be retrieved for a fee. The law requires that emails be stored for five years. By implementing this system, the county would be protected by keeping all emails. This program can store 88 gybtes. This service is \$ 240.00 per month with an installation fee.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked if you could forego the installation fee.

Tyler Moles said that if the total cost is paid annually the cost would be reduced by a third. Mr. Moles feels it is his obligation to protect the county and he has a responsibility to make recommendations that will insure the safety of the county and the network. By installing this program, the computers will not slow down.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said they would like to consider this and would prepay and take advantage of the discount, if we choose to go with this safeguard.

8:00 a.m. Spencer Jones - Great River Associates Re: 2012 Bridge Repair Discussion The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Cheryl Mitchell, Kris Dyer of Save Riverside Bridge organization, Danny Garbee of Billings Special Road District, Eddie Campbell, Josh Byrd of the Planning and Zoning Department and Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Spencer Jones of Great River Associates to discuss the 2012 bridge repairs. Months ago, in response to a MODOT bridge report, the County Commission requested that Great River Associates examine the county bridges with the County's Road Departments. According to Spencer Jones, there were 30 bridges identified that were in need of repair. Of the 30 reported, the county road departments repaired 21 leaving nine that needed extensive work.

Spencer Jones presented a slide show of the 2011 MODOT bridge inspections throughout the county to identify deficiencies and to make recommendations. Terrell Creek Bridge has an alignment issue but is not a high priority in regards to safety. The Billings Special Road District is planning to replace the bridge and would like the county to pay half the cost.

Spencer Jones said that Union Hill and Marshfield Road Bridges have extensive corrosion that has decreased the size of the beams which could make it inadequate to handle the weight. He recommended that the bridges be sandblasted and painted. He also recommended a weathering steel that does not corrode like regular steel. Riverside Bridge was tagged during the inspection by MODOT and deemed unsafe. The county is working with MODOT to offset some of the cost that the county would incur. This is the highest volume bridge in the County and has a significant impact for the economy of Ozark and is imperative to have it operational for the citizens of the county.

Kris Dyer asked if a low water crossing would be possible for the Riverside Bridge.

Spencer said that a low water bridge would not be possible because the area is located in a flood plain and must comply with FEMA regulations.

Kris Dyer asked is the county looking at other options to keep the existing bridge since it is on the national historical registry.

A bridge located within the Ozark Special Road District has extensive cracking on the side walls and head wall and Spencer Jones has been working with them to comply with MODOT'S recommendations.

March 08, 2012

Spencer Jones said that MODOT identified the following bridges to be in high priority for repairs:

- * Green Bridge has a vertical support on the west side of the bridge that has corrosion that has rusted through at the base and needs repair to stabilize it.
- * The structure by the Baptist Church on Riverside Road needs to be straightened.
- * Hawkins Bridge needs attention to the tilt in the vertical trusses and the ibar has corrosion at the center pier which reduces the strength of the bridge. Another cable and new concrete on the northeast side will secure the bridge.
- * Red Bridge needs a retrofit for a new plate that will support the pin due to corrosion. He also recommended that the bridge stay free of debris to stop future corrosion.

MODOT made a recommendation not to repair the Riverside Bridge because it would not be eligible for BRO funds.

The total cost for all the repairs including the bridges located in the Ozark Special and Billings Special Road Districts is approximately \$ 570,000.00.

Eddie Campbell asked if the project would be bid separately.

Spencer Jones replied that the bridge repairs would be bid as whole project but the painting would be bid separately.

Donna Osborn asked who does the inspections.

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Spencer Jones replied that MODOT did the inspection in 2011 and this is a progress report in response to their assessment.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Westen Commissioner Bill Barnett met with John Corona of Barracuda Networks and Tyler Moles from PC Net for a presentation and discussion on web filtering.

Tyler Moles said they have this program in several counties in addition to a good fire wall to avoid viruses.

Mr. Corona said that the Barracuda filter prevents viruses and malware that would enter the network through different websites or emails. This system updates the network every 45 minutes and prevents users from going to sites that could infect the system. They see 95% of the viruses that come from the internet eliminated.

Tyler Moles said that when viruses attack a computer or the network it travels through the network and can cause down time and possible loss of a hard drive.

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SUBJECT:Adoption of Amendments to The Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations for Christian County, Missouri

WHEREAS, the government of Christian County, Missouri (hereinafter the "County"), is mandated by applicable law to address the requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit program requirements as administered by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, related programs; and,

WHEREAS, the County is responsible for stormwater management for the unincorporated area of Christian County and has established Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations approved by the County Commission intended to facilitate the management thereof; and.

WHEREAS, the Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations for Christian County are authorized to be amended from time to time by Order of the Christian County Commission; and,

WHEREAS, the benefits of flood control and surface water quality extend to all citizens, institutions and businesses in the County; and.

WHEREAS, all real property in Christian County, including property owned by public and tax-exempt entities, contributes to stormwater runoff, and either uses or benefits from the County's Stormwater Regulation; and,

WHEREAS, stormwater runoff contributes to non-point source pollution to the streams of the County's watersheds, and a stormwater management program and stormwater facilities can reduce this type of pollution; and.

WHEREAS, the costs of improving, maintaining, operating, monitoring, and otherwise managing a Stormwater System should be allocated, to the extent practicable, to property owners based on the amount of runoff which correlates closely to the amount of impervious surface area of property.

NOW, THEREFORE, on this 12th day of March, 2012, at a duly called meeting of the Christian County Commission, having received the report and recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Administrator and, after public notice, and in open session, upon motion made by Commissioner Barnett, seconded by Presiding Commissioner Lapaglia, with Eastern Commissioner Huff absent, the Christian County Commission did vote unanimously, to amend the Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations for Christian County, Missouri, by adopting the amendments listed below which are intended to clarify certain aspects of the Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations. It will make clear that provisions for stormwater detention are to be considered in all development proposals unless the development meets the criteria specified making it exempt from all or part of the requirements of the regulation. These amendments serve to re-state existing aspects of the regulation which are spread out in various parts of the book making the requirements therein less ambiguous.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Article 1 of The Christian County Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations shall be amended to include the addition of:

Section 5. Stormwater Management Plan Requirements and,

Section 6. Developments Exempt from a Stormwater Management

Plan

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a correction be made to Article 8: changing item B -1, Justified Exceptions to item "C", thereby placing it in line with the other items in that section as it was intended.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the amendments to the Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations for Christian County, Missouri attached hereto, marked as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference shall become effective on the day of signing of this order.

ORDER of the CHRISTIAN COUNTY COMMISSION OZARK, MISSOURI

DATE: March12th, 2012

SUBJECT: AN ORDER ESTABLISHING A STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FUND FOR THAT PORTION OF THE JAMES RIVER WATERSHED WHICH LIES WITHIN CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI

WHEREAS, all real property in Christian County, including property owned by public and tax-exempt entities, that has impervious surfaces increases stormwater runoff, which contributes to non-point source pollution to the streams of the County's watersheds; and

WHEREAS, the government of Christian County, Missouri (hereinafter the "County"), is mandated by applicable law to address the requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) through the small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit program requirements, as administered by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources; and

WHEREAS, the County has also been mandated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA), as administered by MoDNR, to obtain a permit for its stormwater quality management system; and

WHEREAS, the County desires that the benefits of effective stormwater management, flood control and surface water quality be provided to all institutions, businesses and citizens in Christian County to protect them, to the extent practicable, from the loss of life and property damage caused by flooding, and to minimize the impacts to surface water quality from runoff; and

WHEREAS, the County is responsible for stormwater management for the unincorporated areas of Christian County; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to provide a fair, equitable, and dependable source of funds for it to assist in the management of stormwater in Christian County in a manner that complies with applicable federal and state law; and

WHEREAS, management of the Stormwater System to protect the public's health, safety, and welfare requires adequate revenues to partially finance the costs of improving, maintaining, operating, monitoring, and otherwise managing a stormwater management system through a Fee in Lieu of Detention system in specific instances where it is determined to be reasonable and equitable by the County Commission so that each user of the system pays a fee to the extent their property is estimated to contribute to the need for stormwater management based on the amount of runoff which correlates to the amount of impervious surface area of the property; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission believes it is in the public interest to implement a stormwater impact fee to be used to fund the construction, operation, and maintenance of stormwater facilities in the unincorporated areas of the James River Watershed in Christian County, Stormwater System planning, stormwater quality control operations, and review of development plans for compliance with stormwater management codes; and

WHEREAS, the County further recognizes that a Fee in Lieu of Detention may not be appropriate in every given situation and reserves the right to set precedent with each new case considered depending on the unique circumstances surrounding each request.

March 12, 2012

NOW, THEREFORE, on this 12th day of March, 2012, at a duly called meeting of the Christian County Commission, having received the report and recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Administrator and the County's Contract Engineer and, after public notice, and in open session, upon motion duly made by Commissioner Barnett, seconded by Commissioner Lapaglia, with Commissioner Huff being absent, the Christian County Commission did vote to establish a James River Watershed Stormwater Management Fund for that portion of the James River Watershed which lies within the unincorporated areas of Christian County, Missouri,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the "James River Watershed Stormwater Management Fund" (hereinafter referred to as the "Fund") be established to provide a supplemental source of funding and support for the operation, construction and maintenance of Stormwater System facilities; Stormwater System planning: stormwater quality control operations; the review of development plans for compliance with Christian County's Stormwater and Erosion Control Regulations.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the fee in lieu of detention shall be based, in part, on the amount of stormwater that is projected to be discharged into the Stormwater System from each developed parcel of property located within the unincorporated areas of Christian County, Missouri, which are within the James River Watershed, based on the amount of a parcel's impervious surface area. The fee in lieu of detention is intended to assess landowners or developers a fair and equitable fee comparable to the cost of constructing an appropriate Stormwater Management System that they might otherwise be required to build on their property.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all revenues generated from Fees received in Lieu of Detention from real property located in the unincorporated areas of Christian County within the James River Watershed shall be deposited into said Stormwater Fund to be used exclusively for the following Stormwater System Programs and purposes in the James River Watershed:

- acquisition of real property or easements by gift, purchase, or condemnation necessary to construct, operate, and maintain stormwater management facilities;
- costs of administration and implementation of the Stormwater System Program;
- 3 engineering and design, debt service and related financing expenses, planning, construction costs for new Stormwater System facilities, and enlargement or improvement of existing System facilities:
- operation and maintenance of the Stormwater System, related facilities and improvements, including the monitoring, inspection and maintenance of storm water control devices and facilities;
- water quality monitoring and water quality programs; 5.
- inspection and enforcement activities;
- other activities that are reasonably required to manage and operate the Stormwater System.

To the extent the Fees collected in Lieu of Detention are insufficient to construct needed Stormwater System facilities, the cost of the same may be paid from such County funds as may be determined to be necessary by the County Commission in the exercise of its sole discretion.

8:30 a.m. Glen Pace - Human Resource Consultant Re: Matrix

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Chief Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson, Rance Burger from the Springfield News leader and Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs. Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Glen Pace and Chief Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson for a continuation of the county's wage matrix. Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia expressed his appreciation to Glen for his work on the County's strategic plan and the matrix.

Glen Pace said he had received a bunch of information from Tom Lawson that he is using for the matrix. The matrix will consist of 10 different ranges based on the employee's job descriptions. He recommended to the Commission that the matrix be done in a two-step process to raise wages to the median level that is comparable to wages in the area.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we can't compare our wages to Greene County but we should be able to compare ourselves to Stone and Taney Counties. He suggested that we begin with the employees that are on the lowest salary tier. We must prepare for the county to move to a first class status and we want to bring the employees along. The county cannot continue to be a training ground for people to leave for better paying jobs.

Glen Pace said he should have the matrix in the first form and have it finished in the month of May. He is concerned that it will take two steps to begin the process to reach median wage. He said we will run into compression problems because the wage adjustment will have nothing to do with length of service. The wages will be based on job performance and responsibility.

Glen Pace said the biggest problem is the Sheriff's department with the high turnover rate and he doesn't have a solution. The sheriff's deputies are underpaid as well as the road crew.

Tom Lawson presented a spread sheet that is an analysis of the existing staff with the titles associated with the job description.

David Stokely suggested looking at the assessed valuation as a benchmark to determine wages.

Presiding Lou Lapaglia said that we also need to address the issue of the money that we give to the cities and the special road districts.

Glen Pace said that Christian County is a great place to live but there is very little shopping available.

Tom Lawson suggested that the county set a minimum wage for the county. Tom has concern that many of the lower income earners are applying for government assistance because they are living at the poverty level

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we can't control what people do with their money but the cost of living has gone up.

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March 14, 2012

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Tom Lawson presented some background information of an employee that worked in the Sheriff's Department and voluntarily terminated and applied for unemployment. They received it due to problems that were identified in her job.

Kris Dyer asked why it become stagnant has.

The meeting was attended by Prosecuting Attorney Amy Fite, Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs, Treasurer Karen Matthews, Assessor David Stokely, Chief Deputy Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson, Captain Brian Gillman, Brandon Bressie, Collector Ted Nichols, Captain Brian Cathey and Commission Secretary Julia Maples.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Glen Pace to discuss the matrix. Mr. Pace distributed the matrix showing different job categories with the wage range for each one. There was discussion of placing the managers and officials in different ranges.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the county employees have not received a raise in six years and with a 3% annual rate of inflation, they are making 18% less and that needs to stop.

Mr. Pace recommended that the employees in the juvenile office be placed in another category because their wages are shared with Taney County. All of the pay ranges are very low resulting in broad banding. He recommended moving people to different category rather than changing the wages. He also recommended keeping the pay ranges the same for a period of three years. The mid points are for qualified individuals. The Senior Professionals category won't change drastically. There was also discussion regarding seniority or years of service. The operatives' category is very broad and the jailers and deputies that are contained in that category will be separated into different subgroups.

Tom Lawson asked under the operatives, there are corporals and road crew operatives, what is the reason why they both are in that category?

Mr. Pace said these individuals are often scheduled for a twenty-four - seven work day. He said that the operatives are skilled workers. The skilled workers covers everything from white collar to blue collar workers such as sergeants, corporals, road crew, cooks, jailers and patrol deputies. All of these job titles will have separate categories.

Prosecuting Attorney Amy Fite asked are the names set in the categories to stay and will a definition of the category such as Clerical I be provided.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that when this is completed the information will be sent to all the elected officials for feedback.

Mr. Pace said that he will rearrange some of the titles, add in a couple of ranges and a projected new range.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that we want to increase the people in the lowest range first.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia called the meeting of the County Commission to order at 8:25 on April 30, 2012 at the County Commission Office. Attendance: Lou Lapaglia, Present: Bill Barnett, Present: Tom Huff, Absent.Chief Deputy Clerk Norma Ryan is taking the minutes

Motion/Vote - 8:25 a.m. Postpone the Approval of the Minutes

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett made a motion to postpone the approval of the minutes. Lou Lapaglia seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Lou Lapaglia (Yes), Bill Barnett (Yes), Tom Huff (Absent).

8:30 a.m. Josie Bock - Great River Associates - GIS Discussion

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Cheryl Mitchell, Emergency 911Director Rance Duffy, Assessor David Stokely, Deputy Assessor Amy York, Common 2 Road District Supervisor Brent Young, Common 1 Road Richard Teague, County Auditor Sam Yarnell and Jeremy from PC Net.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Josie Bock of Great River Associates. The GIS server is 5-6 years old and is starting to show wear. We are getting ready to get a huge amount of data from the pictometry. We should work proactively and purchase a larger server and get it ready for the pictometry delivery in May or June. Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia estimates \$10,000 for server and \$2,000 per month maintenance.

Assessor David Stokely said pictometry should be here mid-May. Tyler Moles from PC Net estimated \$10,000. Assessor David Stokely said he heard estimates of \$25,000. Jeremy from PC Net said there is the Cloud issue which would be cheaper. Josie is concerned with the connection speed to do editing. Jeremy will find out about the connectivity fees.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia charged Josie to gather information and give us an estimate for the server and labor as soon as possible. There was also discussion of the officeholders and other departments that utilize the GIS data to chip in for the costs of a new server and labor. Tyler Moles will provide a bid notice to be submitted to the paper and anticipates that the server will be installed and running by June 15th, 2012. The Commission will meet with Great River Associates and P.C. Net to discuss the bids to be submitted to the paper.

9:00 a.m. Sheriff Joey Kyle Re: Bid Decision Food Contract

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Cheryl Mitchell, Captain Brian Cathey, Captain Brian Gillman and Lieutentant Brandon Bressie.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Captain Brian Cathey and Captain Brian Gillman to discuss the food contract for the inmates.

Captain Gillman made a recommendation to the County Commission to award the inmate food service to CBM Managed Services based in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. This is a full service company that provides the food, prepares it, serves it to the prisoners and cleans up the kitchen. The service will be provided by the current jail staff. The jail staff would become the employees of CBM Managed Services.

There was an addendum to another proposal regarding the hours that was not accepted. Captain Cathey

estimates that the County will save approximately \$ 32,000.00 by selecting this company. For a 120 inmates the cost per meal is \$ 1.42, and we are currently spending \$ 1.96 per meal. If the inmate population drops below 120 the cost will increase by seven cents to \$ 1.49.

The Commission said that they would like to continue the decision meeting because there are hidden costs such as the appliances that need repair or replacement that have not been considered.

Motion/Vote - Postpone the Food Contract Decision

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett made a motion to postpone the food contract decision to 9:45 a.m. Thursday, May 3, 2012. Lou Lapaglia seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Lou Lapaglia (Yes), Bill Barnett (Yes), Tom Huff (Absent).

10:00 a.m. Christian County Commission Re: Sales Tax Distribution Discussion - 2nd Floor Courtroom

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Treasurer Karen Matthews, Eddie Campbell, Ozark City Mayor Shane Nelson and City Administrator Steve Childers, County Auditor Sam Yarnell, Selmore Special Road District Jack Brazeale, Dorothy and Curtis Doennig, Phil Short and Earl Muilenberg, Road Commissioners of the South Sparta Special Road District, Todd Johnson, Jack Baker, Jeanette Curtis, Fremont Hills City Clerk, Scott Christensen Project Manager for Fremont Hills, Keith Robinette, Rance Duffy Emergency 911 Administrator, Nixa City Administrator Brian Bingle, Danny Garbee and Larry Fabro of the Billings Special Road District, Sparta Alderman Virginia Thompson, Sparta Ward III Alderman, Sparta Mayor Joya Cave, James R. Campbell, Sparta Alderman Ward I, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News, Chief Deputy Clerk Norma Ryan and Chief Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson, Assessor David Stokely, Tom Chudomelka, Sheriff Joey Kyle, Captain Brian Cathey, Scott Bilyeu and John Elkins Road Commissioners of the Ozark Special Road District, Jaredd R. King, Clever City Mayor, Donna Swatzell, City of Nixa Finance Director, Larry Martin of Ozark Public Works Department, Stoneshire Special Road District Commissioners Gerald J. Bellovary, and Raymond C. Krogh, Steve Beyers and Todd Wiesehan, Administrator of the Planning and Zoning Department.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with the cities and the special road districts to discuss tax issues.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia introduced County Clerk Kay Brown, Western Commissioner Bill Barnett, County Counselor John Housley and Commission Secretary Julia Maples and he opened the meeting presenting current and future costs of the County by becoming a first class county.

County Counselor Housley said that if the ballot initiative was followed than the 10 percent that is distributed to the cities and the special road districts would be eliminated and the appropriation of funds would be done through an intergovernmental agreement.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that he spoke with Congressman Charley Denison regarding federal funding. According to Congressman Long, the federal government will not be releasing funds for road and bridge improvements. Then Lou Lapaglia opened the meeting for discussion.

Steve Childers asked, what is the difference between the special road districts and the county road districts.

Counselor John Housley replied that the County maintains the county roads that exist outside the city's in the unincorporated areas. These areas are maintained by the County's Common 1 and Common 2 Road Districts. The county does not maintain roads that lie within the special road districts.

Eddie Campbell mentioned that the special road districts and the County bridge fund receive CART money.

John Elkins said at the time when the tax was passed all the people that live within the special road districts are paying the tax.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we don't have any intention to take over the special road districts. There was never an intergovernmental agreement in the minutes. We are still going to help the special road district and it will be done on a case by case agreement and done with an intergovernmental agreement.

Jack Brazeale asked what happened to the county's levy?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia responded that the ballot language requires the County's levy to be eliminated.

Keith Robinette said this will begin in Jan. 2013, so the special road districts will take about a fifty percent road cut?

Phil Short asked if all the sales tax be given away because the sales tax is actually over fifty percent of our income.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that we should have been doing this all along.

John Housley said there are two half cent sales taxes that the County receives. One of the half cent sales taxes requires that the County's real estate property tax be rolled back to zero. It was a practice of the County Commission to give a portion of the tax to general revenue and the rest was distributed to the cities and the special roads. We are talking about the remaining 10 percent. Rather than giving it out freely without any agreements we will have intergovernmental agreements to satisfy the State Auditor.

John Elkins said we do an audit every year and there has never been any comment in regards to the sales tax that is received from the county.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that the Missouri State Auditor recommended that there be intergovernmental agreements between the entities and the county.

Phil Shortsaid it may not be distributed equally.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said it will be based on need and the state auditor's recommendation will be followed with a intergovernmental agreement.

Mayor Joya Cave from Sparta said how do we know what the South Sparta Special Road District receives?

Gerald J. Bellovary of the Stoneshire Special Road District asked is sales tax going to change and we won't get this any longer?

The fundamental tax that was passed in 1996 for road and bridge maintenance and improvements. They are going to look at it on a countywide basis where the needs are.

Tom Chudomelka asked Mr. Housley to explain why we don't have a levy. The state statute said that we had to roll back the levy because it was a trade off by state law. If you wanted a general sales tax then the property tax must go to zero to be in compliance to the Hancock Amendment.

Jack Brazeale asked what amount of money are we discussing.

Shane Nelson said the cities and the special road districts are where the majority of the tax money comes from and isn't that taking from those who are providing the sales tax. Shane says there must be some

agreement to do this within a three or four year process.

Scott Bilyeu we can show you all our improvements.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said your roads are in shape at the cost of the County Road Departments.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said he has approximately 250 miles of road and they are not all hot mixed roads.

Jack Brazeale we got stuck with the old highway left from the state and asked the county to assist with the paving that highway.

Commission Secretary Julia Maples said that we have no source of revenue and one was specifically designated to go to the County's General Revenue fund.

Eddie Campbell said that Mr. Housley reviewed the ballot language that said that there was a tradeoff to roll back the county property tax to zero and be completely funded by sales tax.

Mr. Housley entered an order to roll back the county real estate tax.

Phil Short Commissioner of South Sparta Special asked will the pool of money be set aside for the road districts.

Bud Pierce of the City of Billings said then the cities will no longer receive the funds and we will have to fire three people.

Ray Krogh Commissioner of Stoneshire Special Road District suggested to initiate a property tax increase.

Sheriff Kyle asked John Housley, there is ten percent to the road districts then what is the obligation to the road districts and is that a legal obligation?

John Housley said that there is no legal obligation and there is no agreement on file but it is his understanding that the money has been spent properly.

Steve Childers said that the cities are going to take the hardest hit and priorities will have to shift. He has concern that the special road districts and the cities will be in competition for the same pool of money. Is there a phasing process by which this can be done over a period of time?

Treasurer Karen Matthews said that she has lived here her whole life there was a time where a hand shake was important. Common 1 and Common 2 Road Districts would not require a vote of the people to impose a tax levy. You will eventually bankrupt the special road districts. The State Auditor makes recommendations but that is only a recommendation. The cities are responsible for bringing in the businesses not the county. If you do this there will not be a lot of working together.

Keith Robinette suggested having a board of four or five people to review the requests and to make the decisions.

John Elkins are we going to have an Eastern Commissioner?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia stated that Mr. Huff has a submitted a letter from his doctor making him ineligible to work. Presiding Commissioner Lapaglia stated that he placed a call to the Attorney General and he said there is nothing they can do. The Attorney General said that we have to back off from pursuing to have Tom Huff removed or go through the Prosectors office.

Keith Robinette said by putting all the needs into one pool, it will cause all the special road districts to be

pitted against each other for the funds. He recommended that the Commission put a board together of road district Commissioners to select the road districts that are eligible for the funds.

Scott Bilyeu said he was disappointed with the unveiling of the CC Corridor project that it contains all these trees and shrubs.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this fifteen to twenty five year project and it strictly conceptual. Eddie Campbell said that the CC Corridor expansion is an investment in the county.

Larry Martin of the City of Ozark said that alliances were made at that time to support the tax. These alliances were established and are needed for future development.

Keith Robinette spoke about going to a first class county the special road districts will be required to give 25% of their budget to the cities that are in the special road districts.

Keith Robinette said that Ozark Special has an intergovernmental agreement with Fremont Hills.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that we will still spend all the money but it will be driven by need instead of just handing over money without any agreements.

Donna Osborn asked for verification of the ratio and how it was distributed. Prior to 2004, the special road districts received 75 percent of the funds and the county receives 25 percent. The Commission sent a letter in 2004 stating that the ratio would be reduced to 60 percent and the County would keep 40 percent of the funds.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia thanked everyone for attending the meeting for participating in the discussion.

Keith Rollings had questions about the specs and the bid notice dates of January 1 through December 31, 2012, versus the renewal date of July 1, 2012.

Greg Williams replied that last year the County was with Trident and the policy expires on 12/31/12. What we are looking at is affective July 1, 2012 through July 1, 2013.

Commission Secretary Julia Maples asked should she have put the date in the insurance notice as July 1, and not January 1.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia affirmed that the contract will begin on July 1, 2012 through July 1, 2013. The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Chief Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson, Treasurer Karen Matthews, Collector Ted Nichols, Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs and County Auditor Sam Yarnell.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Glen Pace, Human Resource Consultant to discuss the matrix of the county's strategic planning. Mr. Pace presented the proposed pay ranges for all six categories.

Chief Deputy Tom Lawson asked is the low point wage of \$ 10.00, where a new hire would be. Mr. Pace said that \$ 10.00 per hour would be classified as the lowest wage given by the county.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that the minimum hourly rate of \$10.00 is the lowest based on the surrounding community and is under what Stone County a third class county is paying.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said to bring everyone to the mid-range on the wage matrix would cost the county a little over 15%.

Mr. Pace will give definitions and pay ranges for each category. The matrix pay range will change every three years to keep up with inflation.

Treasurer Karen Matthews asked does this schedule include the benefits with the wages. If you look at the trends there are less people working.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said we still need to show the benefits because it is part of their wages.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said she is appreciative of the health insurance and vacation time provided by the county.

Assistant Donovan Dobbs stated that you get what you pay for and you can't work miracles. He agreed that the matrix is a good idea and should be given to the elected officials for review. We are not in the business of making more money by increasing our price. We are limited to the sales tax revenue.

Tom Lawson agreed that everyone should also receive a list of the benefits that are paid for them in addition to their hourly wage. For each employee there is additional one third paid in benefits.

The office holders meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 27th, at 8:30 a.m.

Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs made a suggestion to have a sick bank where sick time can be donated from employees to be used for those individuals that have exhausted all their sick time and need additional time to recover from an illness or a surgery.

June 20, 2012

Mr. Pace said in Missouri one employee cannot donate time to another particular person. However, a sick time pool can be used to donate additional time to employees that have an extended recovery and have exhausted all of their time. Some tax payers may say that by giving up sick time it creates an expense because the employee that donated the time would not have used the time anyway.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia stated that we will present this proposal to the office holders at the Wednesday meeting.

8:30 a.m. Christian County Commission Re: Sales Tax Discussion Meeting

The meeting was attended by Virginia Thompson Alderman for the City of Sparta, Don Thompson, Scott Bilyeu and John Elkins Road Commissioners for the Ozark Special Road District, Shane Nelson Ozark CIty Mayor, Laura L. Umphenour, Roger A. Umphenour, Scott Christiensen, Mayor Ronald Elkins, Sr., Bob and Kathryn Estep, Dallas Killian, Jeanette Curtis, Deputy Clerk of the City of Fremont Hlls, Leroy and Judy Morissett, Andy R. Arndt, Collector Ted Nichols, County Auditor Sam Yarnell, Ray Krogh Commissioner of the Stoneshire Road District, Todd Wiesehan, Administrator of the Planning and Zoning Department, Bob Rubino, Carol Garrison, Shirley, Lawrence, Sharon A. Peregrin, Marsha Lawrence, Rance Duffy E-911 Director, Dorothy and Curtis Doennig, Larry Fabro, Steve Maples, Keith Robinette, Jeff Daughherty, Jeff Brown, Brent Young, Supervisor of the Common 2 Road District, Phil Short Commissioner of the South Sparta Road District, Jim Campbell, Alderman for the City of Sparta, Danny Garbee, Billings Special Road District Secretary and Eddie Campbell.

Presiding Commissioner introduced County Commission Secretary Julia Maples, County Counselor John Housley, Chief Deputy Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson, Chief Deputy Clerk Norma Ryan, Eastern Commissioner Tom Huff and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett. On April 30th, 2012, we had a meeting to discuss the sales taxes issue that passed in 1996 and 1997 and the funds that have been distributed. We want to do what the law says. We have out grown what we have always done based on a handshake. The County Commission does not have the authority to appropriate funds to an entity without and intergovernmental agreement. We have a lot to do financially such as the Riverside Bridge.

The Presiding Commissioner read an opinion letter from County Counselor John Housley, regarding the two countywide sales taxes that were passed in 1996 and 1997. There is no mention that the funds derived from these two sales tax should be distributed to the cities and the special road districts. The County Commission has volunteered to distribute these funds to the cities and the special road districts based on a hand shake agreement. It has been repeatedly referenced by the Missouri state auditors in their audits of the Christian County. There is no statutory authority or obligation for the County Commission to distribute these funds without any written agreement. Any transfer of funds must be done through an intergovernmental agreement with each entity. Each contract shall be in writing and duplicate copies will be executed and entered into the minutes and be placed on file with the County Clerk's Office.

The next letter that was read was sent from Prosecuting Attorney Amy Fite, in which the Prosecutor affirms the letter sent by County Counselor John Housley regarding the county wide sales tax. This letter is to further clarify a prior letter regarding seeking an Attorney General's opinion in regards to the law. According to Prosecutor Fite, there is no basis to seek an opinion because the law is very clear. By July 20, 2012, the county must come into compliance with the law or further action will be taken to bring the county into compliance. Prosecutor Fite said we have been comingling funds and we have possibly been giving money in error. To distribute funds to the special road districts and the cities there will be two signatures on every transfer order and intergovernmental agreement.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett addressed the audience and said all we need is an intergovernmental agreement, He called County Auditor Sam Yarnell to come to the front of the room and asked her why

haven't you said that we needed contracts. County Auditor Sam Yarnell replied that what has been signed in the past is not an intergovernmental agreement.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said that all we have to do is pass an ordinance and we will continue as we always have done. He encouraged the crowd to speak to those running for Eastern Commissioner and ask them where they stand on the sales tax issue.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that is not a correct intergovernmental agreement.

Ms. Laura Umphenour addressed the two sales taxes that was voted by the people and someone did a handshake to transfer the funds to other entities and that is illegal. How much money did this handshake transfer, in excess of 20 million. Is there is any plan in getting these money's back?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia replied that we don't have the money and neither does the special road districts.

Ms. Laura Umphenour said that we voted to have these moneys flow into the county and she referenced the 54.140 and read it to those present. In closing Laura said she appreciates that Lou Lapaglia follows the law

Treasurer Karen Matthews said she has never transferred any funds without the signatures of the County Commission and the Clerk.

Roy Matthews said if you check the newspaper articles and other documentation that the people knew exactly where the money would go. We do have a resolution that we will do the right thing and there is no doubt in his mind.

Treasurer Karen Matthews asked how long Mrs. Umphenour has lived here.

Mrs. Umphenour said she is a tax payer

Treasurer Karen Matthews read a letter from County Counselor John Housley that referenced 50.020. It is the treasurer's concern that the special road districts will go broke based on the receipts she handles.

Leo Snelling said that this is an informational meeting as to what is being done and what should be done in the future and there is no recourse for the funds that have been disbursed. The problem is that we are still not following the law. In his opinion, the current form that is used by the special road districts does not qualify as an intergovernmental agreement that it should be revised every year. They should also submit their budget and be specific to the expenditures and if you do this you will be in compliance with the law. This is simply a bitch session.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that was what the meeting held April 30th was to address the need for intergovernmental agreements.

Scott Bilyeu said you have had a year and a half to determine that the agreements that we have signed were not adequate. Your attorney has been on duty for a number of years. We are audited and we would have sent it to you.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that we started after seven months of beginning his term. There have been many commissioners before me that never addressed this issue.

Rick Gardner asked the Commission, are you willing to go forward with the proper intergovernmental agreements?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the amounts that you received in the past will not be the same. The cities including Highlandville will receive the funds with the proper intergovernmental agreements.

Rick Gardner are willing to take over all the roads if they are not being taken care of due to reduction of funds?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the funds will not be the same and the cities will also be included in the road fund to be distributed. Everyone will get a little less. There are not additional funds from the state and federal government to be allocated for the Riverside Bridge.

One individual asked what can the residents on the other side of the Riverside Bridge do to help you to get the bridge back in operation.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia encouraged him to write the Legislators about his concern to have the Riverside Bridge open because it is the busiest bridge in the county. We have to put money away to build the bridge.

Robert Palmer said there is only one revenue source for the county which is the sales tax. The roads are so bad where he lives he is forced to go to Springfield. If the roads were better people would shop in Christian County which would then increase the sales tax revenue.

Mayor Shane Nelson do you want the sales tax revenue to decline due to the poor condition of the roads? Most of the people want this to continue as it always has. The county is expending funds for the Highway CC Corridor and we support that effort. If you pull this out it won't be good for the cities and the special road districts.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said they will get the funds but a reduced amount.

Bob Rubino expects the elected leaders to abide by the law. What happens to the road districts when the county moves into a first class county.

John Housley said that the road districts will continue.

John Elkins voiced his concern that we have to run the county like a business. Any CEO will listen to their customers and you were acting as a King. No one has consulted us and different alternatives to building a bridge and it can built for less money with a concrete slab but no one has come to us.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked Mr. Elkins to listen to the tape of the meeting on April 30, 2012, and I will anticipate an apology. We would be helping the road districts that need it the most.

MOTION/VOTE Postpone the Next Meeting to 10:00 a.m.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett Bill made a motion that we postpone the next meeting until 10:00. Tom Huff seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Lou Lapaglia (Abstain) Bill Barnett (Yes), and Tom Huff (Yes).

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said if we can get FEMA the BRO funds as a 80/20 match than the county could give \$ 350,000.00 from the bridge fund which currently has \$ 700,000. There are some funds that are being used for bridge repairs and if we get Ozark Special to contribute than all we need is to pour new pilings.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia replied that there are no federal funds available and it may be two to three years or longer. None of the Federal, state, or local entities are willing to contribute to the Riverside Bridge. As of Memorial Day weekend, after speaking with Billy Long, there is no money coming.

Mr. Robinette that is associated with the Ozark Special Road District asked does the intergovernmental agreement have to be annual.

Mr. Housley said that once the intergovernmental agreement is in place for a specific purpose it could extend beyond a year but it would not go on forever based on 70.220 of the Missouri State Statutes.

City of Ozark. He also asked about the levy for the County and the special road districts.

Kay Brown said that both commissioners made the decision not to levy a tax but to keep it at zero.

Keith Robinette said that they have done agreements with the county on the bridges and it has worked well as well as the City of Ozark and Fremont Hills.

Pat Platter addressed Mr. Housley that he has a permissible view point on intergovernmental agreement and that what is currently in place and all the citations that mandates the County Commission to have 100 percent power over the funds there is nothing that prohibits the County Commission continue as they currently are doing.

Spencer Jones said that we are working win the transportation system and the cities and the special road districts to accommodate the growth in the county. Christian County must be ready with matching funds when there are funds released. There has never been any discussion or intent to dissolve the special road districts. We are all working together to improve the transportation system to improve the county. It has never been the intent of the County to disenfranchise any special road but to incorporate the cities and the special road districts not duplicate the effort.

Keith Robinette said that the special road districts cannot function without the sale tax. What are we going to do when there is a need for snow removal and there are no funds?

The Mayor of the City of Clever has a comprehensive plan to repair our streets and we can't continue to fix our streets without the funds provided by the county. If you let it go to long than it costs too much to repair.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the funds will not stop but the amount will be different. We have also received a letter from the City of Highlandville requesting that they receive their portion of the sales tax.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia made a motion to authorize the county to proceed with an order that would be effective January 1, 2013, but it failed for lack of a second.

Motion/Vote - Approve the Distribution of Sales Tax Revenue

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett made a motion to approve the order to distribute the sales tax revenue to most of the cities and the special road districts. Tom Huff seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Lou Lapaglia (Abstain), Bill Barnett (Yes), Tom Huff (Yes).

SUBJECT: Distribution of Sales Tax Revenue

WHEREAS, in November, 1996, the voters of Christian County approved a countywide general sales tax of one-half (1/2) of one percent (1%) pursuant to MO. REV. STAT. § 67.505 and said revenues are to be deposited into the County's general revenue fund; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 1997, the voters of Christian County approved a countywide sales tax of one-half (1/2) of one percent (1%) for the purpose of funding road and bridge improvements, maintenance and operations; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri State Auditor's audits of Christian County criticized the County Commission's prior practice of making annual distributions of general sales tax revenues to the Cities and special road districts, as well as the disbursement of sales taxes earmarked for road and bridge purposes to said Cities in Christian County and special road districts without an intergovernmental agreement pursuant to MO. REV. STAT. § 70.220.1 which specified the use of the taxes was to be used for road and bridge purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

- (A) The County Commission of Christian County, Missouri directs the County Treasurer to deposit into the County's General Revenue Fund all the sales tax revenue received from the Director of Revenue pursuant to the countywide general sales tax of one-half (1/2) of one percent (1%) adopted by the voters in 1996 and collected pursuant to section 67.505, RSMo.
- (B) The County Commission further directs the County Treasurer, pursuant to section 54.140 RSMo., to establish a separate account denominated as the "Road and Bridge Sales Tax Fund", and deposit all sales tax revenue generated by the countywide one-half (1/2) cent sales tax earmarked for road and bridge improvements, maintenance and operations into said special account, said sales tax being adopted by the voters in 1997 and collected pursuant to section 67.547,RSMo.
- (C) Effective upon entry of this Order, twenty percent (20%) of the one-half (1/2) cent general sales tax revenue and all the sales tax revenue generated by the county-wide one-half (1/2) cent sales tax earmarked for road and bridge improvements, maintenance and operations shall be distributed on a monthly basis to Common Road 1, Common Road 2, the special road districts and the cities in Christian County listed below in the percentages assigned to each entity:

The foregoing distribution formula for the one-half (1/2) cent general revenue sales taxes and the one-half (1/2) cent road and bridge sales tax revenues shall continue until the County Commission establishes its 2013 budget in January, 2013, or the County Commission votes to change the funding allocations, whichever come first, whereupon the allocation of sales tax funds to be used for road and bridge improvements or maintenance for Common Road 1, Common Road 2, the special road districts and cities in Christian County shall be determined by a majority vote of members of the Christian County Commission reflected in the minutes of the County Commission maintained by the County Clerk.

(D) Any distribution of sales tax revenues by the County Commission to a special road district or City in Christian County shall be accompanied by an Intergovernmental agreement executed by the County Commission and each political subdivision that is a recipient of sales tax funds pursuant to MO. REV. STAT. §§ 70.210 through 70.320

Said Agreement shall describe the specific road or bridge improvement, maintenance or operations the funds will be expended upon and require a quarterly accounting by the recipient to the County Auditor, supported by receipts, documentation and bank statements, sufficient to verify the tax proceeds were expended exclusively for such purpose(s).

THIS ORDER shall be in full force and effect beginning the date it is executed by the County Commission.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the matrix has been a process that has taken several months and has been an eye opening experience. Mr. Pace passed out a copy of the matrix which separates the employees into six categories and the specific wage range associated with the title.

Mr. Pace said that county government follows a similar pattern as to how their people are paid. There has been numerous salary surveys done to create a range for each particular category. There is a low, middle and high range based on the job description and title. The goal is to bring the wages of the employees to the mid range of the matrix. This matrix will serve for three years and at the end of the three years the ranges must be adjusted for inflation. In County government everyone is below the mid range in every county in the state and most of our people are also below the mid range and some below the minimum level. The increase in wages will be based on an increase of sales tax. The goal is to first bring the workers that are below the minimum range up to the minimum and then move toward the midrange.

Donna Osborne asked does the matrix include the private sector as well as the county's wages?

Mr. Pace replied that typically a for- profit corporation has a 4% average increase in income but government relys on sales tax and you don't know what that will be.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell said the county pays 100% of the health insurance premium for the employees, one retirement is also paid and there are fourteen paid holidays. Each employee receives an additional 33 percent in benefits that the county provides.

Mr. Pace said in the private sector employees that are paid less have better benefits. The majority of the private sector companies do not offer a retirement plan nor do they make contributions to any 401k plans, and on average a company will contribute 3% to a 401k.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that the employees have not recieved a pay increase in six years and the general funds must increase to provide higher wages and benefits.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said the Justice Center will soon be paid and we will have 1.5 million that will no longer be used for the jail payment.

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Recorder Kelly Hall asked about the three people that work in her office that don't receive health insurance with no additional pay.n Also how do you determine if there are funds to give raises.

Glen said that we will have to have another meeting to discuss the funds are available

Assessor David Stokely asked what the definition for office and clerical 1 individuals that are not in a leadership position.

Mr. Pace said that the category for clerical one is a broad group developed by a federal definition and it includes everyone as a service worker, office administrators, clerical and others. This range does not mea there will be an automatic pay increase.

We will put this into effect on January 1, 2012. We have to move our people off the bottom of the range.

Commission Secretary Julia Maples made a recommendation to have Mr. Pace email a description to her to be sent to the office holders for their review.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said there will be another meeting in July to finish the matrix.

Recorder Kelly Hall said will raises be given once a year and will the cafeteria plan be renewed?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that we have to look at the revenues and the cafeteria plan will not be done.

Assessor David Stokely said we deeply appreciate the County Commission for the work they have done to create this matrix.

Chief Deputy Clerk Tom Lawson said if you want to change a classification send it to Julia. This current list is obsolete because we have two or three new employees and terminiations every month.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett expressed his appreciation to Mr. Pace for the great job he did on the matrix.

Mr. Pace expressed his appreciation to Tom Lawson and his staff at the university to put this together.

After the County Counselor and the County Prosecutor got involved the transfer of funds could only be done through an intergovernmental agreement. The Prosecutor placed a deadline for the County to come into compliance with the law by July 20, 2012. Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with County Counselor John Housley and Treasurer Karen Matthews to discuss financial procedures of transferring county funds.

Carson Elliff said that DNR (Department of Natural Resources) has issued a permit for the Riverdowns West sewer project and he has had many conversations with Frontier and could not speak on behalf of the county. Carson Elliff has been supplied the plans and specs which have been filed with the county and a proposed assessment role to send to the property owners to be filed with the county. The following need to be considered such as: the necessary easements, transfers to the county, maintenance contract that is contracted with the property owners of the Riverdowns West subdivision and the performance and payment of bonds. Currently ,the bonds are made out to Frontier and he doesn't think this is what we would want. He has concerns about the plans and specs and DNR has approved them but they don't look at the details, financials or the contractor that will be building the sewer system. Frontier has done pilot projects but not built one for commercial use. He has general concern for the whole matter and thought it was important that the Commission be aware of these matters because he is working with the County and is seeking guidance from the Commission.

County Counselor John Housley concurs with Carson Elliff that surely the Riverdowns West needs a sewer treatment plant. DNR issued a permit on new technology: It was efficient and affordable for what they needed. He felt good that DNR issued the permit. He has looked at the plans and specs and they cannot be used as they are now. At the end of the day it has to be put out to bid and more people will be bidding on the project. Whoever is the lowest and/or best bid will be awarded the contract. He has concern of their financial capability to build the treatment plant. The performance bonds are very important so there are no liens. In any case the County is responsible because if the homeowners don't have the money the county would be acting as the bank.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said he is assuming that a permit has been issued by DNR and under no circumstances do we want the bonds issued to Frontier.

Carson Elliff said that DNR said there will be other bidders that will be lower

Collector Ted Nichols asked Carson Elliff if it is feasible that the project will be completed this year? Carson Elliff replied that it won't happen this year.

Assessor David Stokely asked is there an existing NID in place. Carson Elliff said there was a petition to create one but it hasn't started.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Sheriff Joey Kyle to discuss personnel discussion.

Brian Cathey has been crunching numbers and the volume of inmates has resulted in an amendment to the 2012 budget of an increase of \$ 90,000. Our figures with the increase of six employees should be ahead by \$ 500,000 to the good as compared to last year. We are averageing 65 to 70 Christian County inmates and 45 to 50 Federal inmates. The additional revenue from housing the federal inmates would enable us to have three more on patrol and three in the jail.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we will save an additional \$ 200,000.00.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked can we reduce the Building Bond transfer If this goes through we will trim the amount of transfers from General Revenue and Building Bond.

Sheriff Kyle said we would hire two at a time and there will be a total of 86 employees. If we hire all 6 employees this would trim the transfer of funds by \$200,000.00.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell said that she would like to see more hired to reduce the overtime that continues to accrue.

Sheriff Kyle said the overtime should be reduced by having the extra people.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell said that by the end of December there will be 82 employees in the Sheriff's Department.

It is most gratifying to announce that the cost cutting done in the 2011 budget by each office and the increase in the 2012 sales tax has made it possible for the Commission to give a 5% raise to all the employees across the board. The County Commission are very proud of what you have done and it has been 6 years for the county employees to have a wage increase. Anyone that has a business with employees is a competitor and it was recognized in February we wanted to get past the half year mark and if our plans are on target than it is time to give back to our employees and to move forward according to the matrix. We must attack this from the bottom wage earners and work to get them to the mid-point range of the matrix. Terry Goodall of the Juvenile offices will be working with Taney County to participate in the pay increase. This pay increase is in effect beginning 7/22/12 through 8/4/12 and the pay increase will be reflected on the August 10, 2012 pay check. This will be a 5% increase across the board

Sheriff Joey Kyle asked is this a cost of living raise or a pay raise.

Motion/Vote - Approve the 5% Employee Pay Increase

Spencer Jones said they have determined from the roof inside that some of the walls are leaking. There is a product that is a wrap that covers the roof and the walls of the building.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said that there was tuck-pointing done before and the walls were also

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cleaned.

Mr. Tindall said we need to make the building water tight before cleaning the brick. There is also some cornice work that needs repair which will take scaffolding to reach it. The next step is to put a budget together to estimate the cost of the project which will help us when working with the roofing contractor. The roofing contractor has offered to provide an infrared camera that will help to find the leaks in the wall and the roof. It will be hard to coordinate the Ozark Fire Department and the infrared test to determine where the water is coming in. The City of Ozark agreed to sell us the water for the test at a bulk rate.

Spencer Jones said we will put together the grant and submit it for approval.

Travis Tindle recommended walking around the building for additional items that need to be listed in the grant.

Treasurer Karen Matthews asked will the historic grant pertain to anything on the inside.

Travis said that this grant is specifically for the outside of the building. There are very strict guidelines for this grant. The historic courthouse is already on the historic preservation list.

He said the objective of doing a raise at this time is to bring the employees to the minimum range and work towards the midpoint. This matrix will apply for the next three years and then it will be adjusted. The matrix will work as long as there is revenue to support it, such as an increase in the countywide sales tax.

Prosecuting Attorney Amy Fite asked about breaking out office clerical 1 and 2 for those that work in those departments that have a degree as a paralegal.

Glen Pace said he will build more specific definitions with a possible office clerical 3.

Terry Goodall from the Juvenile office said they have a unique office because it is funded by two counties.

Glen Pace said he purposely left the juvenile office out of the matrix because of the funding.

Tom Lawson said the mid -point is the target where we want to be.

Glen Pace said the mid-point would be desirable but it would be difficult due to funding to bring everyone to the midpoint.

Tom Lawson asked how you would advise the elected officials to apply the 5% raises.

Recorder Kelly Hall asked what do you do with the other employees that are at the mid-point range?

Glen Pace said the range goes on and an employee can exceed the mid-point.

Assessor David Stokely asked where are we going to start because it appears that everyone that is listed in his office are based on the wages and not job definition. He would have like to see a special category for his employees.

Glen Pace said he will get back with Mr. Stokely. Glen Pace said there job duties are categorized by the Division of Labor Standards and he wants everyone in the correct place.

Tom Lawson said the classification and the ranges overlap a great deal and you could move someone to another classification and still be within the same dollar amount.

Glen Pace expressed his appreciation for the constructive comments.

Collector Ted Nichols expressed his appreciation to Glen Pace for his work.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked after the matrix is established we can pay based on productivity and performance of the individual.

Glen Pace said after we get past the initial across the board of a pay increase than there will be increases for top performers.

Glen Pace responded hopes to have a performance appraisal by the end of this year. How frequent do you have performance reviews.

The investment made by the County in this project could be anticipated to pay for itself one hundred fold in the years to come.

The following entities are participating and contributing the following amounts. The Cities of Ozark and Nixa are each contributing \$ 24,447.50. The Chamber of Commerce for Nixa and Ozark are each contributing \$ 5,000.00 and Christian County will contribute \$ 10,000.00.

Todd Wiesehan is asking for a formal endorsement that the county will participate in this project. The name of the team is known as ONE which stands for Ozark and Nixa Economic Development Partnership of Christian County. A copy of the RFQ and the proposal sent by this particular firm is available for review. They brought the most to the table Theory into Practice from Austin Texas "TIP". MSU offered a proposal and it was high and compared to the offer proposals it did not rate well.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia called the meeting of the County Commission to order at 2:00 p.m. on August 1, 2012 at the County Commission Office. Attendance: Lou Lapaglia, Present: Bill Barnett, Present: Tom Huff, Absent. County Clerk Kay Brown is taking the minutes.

2:00 p.m. Treasurer Karen Matthews Re: Financial Discussion

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Chief Deputy Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson Roy Matthews and Treasurer Karen Matthews, Sheriff Joey Kyle, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News, Sharon Syler of Preferred Enterprises, Jeff Brown, Eddie Campbell, Terri Merritt, County Auditor Sam Yarnell, Assessor David Stokely, Chief Deputy Clerk Norma Ryan and County Counselor John Housley.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with County Counselor John Housley to discuss the County's financials.

Mr. Housley opened the discussion that we are looking at the moneys coming into the county and being dispersed to the cities and the special road districts and the Prosecutor's letter regarding comingling of funds to satisfy the requirements 54.140 RSMo. According to the Prosecutor's letter, the funds for the special road districts and the cities should be kept separate for accounting purposes. According to the County Auditor, the sales taxes are being set apart by the intergovernmental agreements which are in the process of signing. The sales tax money that is designated for CART funds are also being distributed. It is the County Counselor's recommendation that the CART funds be kept in a separate account. CART funds are a creature of the state constitution and there are regulations that control how the funds can be spent. CART funds cannot be issued to a city nor can a special road district use them to build a bridge.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that the funds are sent to the county by a wire transfer from the Department of Revenue.

County Counselor Housley said that it shall be the duty of the County Treasurer to separate the funds and issue the pay out by a warrant. These are special funds and should not be placed in the County general revenue account.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said she sent out an email to the county treasurers and they responded that they keep all the funds in general revenue. The funds are divided and put in the proper place within county revenue. The Treasurer does not see this process as comingling funds. There have been twenty people that have been involved in this process and audited by independent auditors and two state auditors and there has never been a recommendation. She said there are more problems that are being created by making these changes.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked what happens to the CART funds in Greene County.

Counselor Housley said the Greene County has one department for road and bridge that receive the property tax. They don't have special road districts.

County Counselor said that the Prosecutor's letter that the sales taxes and the CART taxes come into one account and distributed by transfer orders. The Prosecutor said that we need intergovernmental agreements when transferring funds and it was brought to his attention that the CART funds also need to be separated.

August 01, 2012

The process really falls back on the County Treasurer. He is not trying to create problems but trying to be conservative and comply with the Prosecutor's letter and the statutes.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said that the CART funds are placed in a separate account divided by a percentage for each special road district.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that Josie has been working on the GIS map to confirm the mileage within each special road district, which is the basis of the percentage. The Commission has received a total of five intergovernmental agreements.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that Josie was trying to come up with a formula for the road districts mileage based on the GIS mapping. Since the IGA is in place and we have a total of five intergovernmental agreements. These intergovernmental agreements are for this year.

County Counselor John Housley said we need to formalize the percentages for the CART funds, prepare an order with an intergovernmental agreement stating that none of the funds will be spent on any bridge within the special road district.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said he would like to keep it the way it is.

Mr. Housely, said that the CART fund be placed in one account for transfer orders.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia suggested having a separate intergovernmental agreement strictly for CART funds.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell said the county sales tax should be left in the County General Revenue and the remaining funds should be completely transferred leaving a zero balance.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said there is a line item for sales tax and the road and bridge sales tax should be split out and setting up one account and it should be dispersed and leave the county revenue in the big account.

Roy Matthews said that the CART and the two half cent taxes go into one account and the county lives off their portion.

Treasurer Karen Matthews was confused how the account would zero out.

County Counselor Sam Yarnell said the way we have done is that the sales tax comes in at the first of the month and then dispersed.

County Counselor Housley asked are you paying bills for the special road districts as their treasurer. In his opinion, the special road districts are a separate entity and should have their own bank account.

Sharon Syler from Preferred Enterprises said they are a separate entity and their money should not be the county bank account.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said that the special road districts provide a warrant that is signed by the special road district commissioners. If we must have a separate account for the special road districts what about the County's Common 1 and 2 Road districts and bridge.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia as long as the accounts are separate and an intergovernmental agreement is done that instructs the special road district commissioners that the CART funds cannot be used for a bridge that lies within the special road districts.

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Sheriff Joey Kyle said he had concern for error by having all special road districts commissioners sign checks.

County Counselor John Housley said the special road districts are a separate entity with an elected board.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett asked couldn't the Treasurer continue to write the checks and let the special road commissioners sign the checks.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Emergency Management Administrator Phil Amtower to discuss the Memorandum of Understanding that would appoint Phil Amtower as the Emergency Director for the City of Fremont Hills and City of Nixa. County Counselor John Housley has reviewed and approved the Memorandum of Understanding.

Mr. Amtower also presented a standard operating procedure for the use of the Reverse 911. This standard operating procedure manual has been reviewed by the County Counselor. The purpose for this document is to specify that the system can only be used in an emergency such as a boil order, public health and to alert the public to safety. This document will outline what the responsibilities are for the users such as the City of Nixa and Ozark. The operating procedure does not include the cost share and Mr. Housley will assist Mr. Amtower to put this together so that all the cities can participate based on an approximate cost of approximately \$ 10,000.00. Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Carson Elliff and County Counselor John Housley to hire the independent engineer for the sewer project for the Riverdowns West Subdivision.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia stated on May 16th, 2011, the Commission voted to assist the

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Riverdowns West Subdivision to obtain funding to resolve their sewer crisis due to pending health issues and DNR penalties. We don't want to be in the sewer business but the County is obligated since there is no other means to obtain funding by the homeowners.

Carson said that the preliminary specs were approved by DNR and based on the decision of the County Commission we need to give the plans and specs to the engineer.

Chad Zickefoose said he would like to give the project to Frontier as a sole source company and they could construct it as they wish.

Carson Elliff, John Housley and Chad Zickefoose had further discussion and because it is the public's money it should be bid out.

County Counselor John Housley said that Frontier will not bid on the project but they will partner with other companies. They don'w want to be the general contractor.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said they have been generous to put their equipment in for free. Carson Elliff said that Frontier declined to bid on the project due to bond requirements.

Spencer Jones said he will provide a scope of services and fees to be approved by the County Commission to be reveiwed a week from today and a review of the ownership and operating maintenance of the project.

Spencer Jones asked should we ask for an extension from DNR and is there a contract in place for the temporary plant to continue the use of the sewer treatment plant?

1:30 p.m. Sheriff Joey Kyle Re: Vehicle Management

The meetring was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Sheriff Joey Kyle, Captain Brian Cathey, Blanca Mallonee and Auditor Sam Yarnell.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Western Commissioner Bill Barnett met with Sheriff Joey Kyle to discuss the possiblity of using the Sheriff's personal car instead of purchasing another fleet car. Sheriff Kyle said that with the increase of deputies there are different ways to manage the fleet of vehicles. The Sheriff was approved for four vehicles. The Sheriff purchased two vehicles earlier in the year and he would like to buy the two remaining.

The Sheriff is in need of another vehicle for the additional deputies. He suggested that his vehicle could be reassigned and he could use his own personal vehicle for county work to be used for a short time rather than to purchase another vehicle. The Sheriff would be reimbursed for the use of his vehicle and it would be paid from the CCW revolving fund.

The Sheriff said that by using his own personal vehicle, he would receive a flat thousand dollars a month which would be kept in a separate bank account. The additional funding would be provided through the CCW discretionary fund. He will keep a log for accounting purposes of his personal and business mileage and the statute allows for him to receive the current mileage rate of 55.5 cents. The Sheriff estimates using 2,500 to 3,000 miles per month resulting in approximately \$ 1,750.00 for mileage costs. He will use the gas card for county business but not for personal use.

The County Commission met with County Counselor John Housley, Bond Attorney Carson Elliff and Spencer Jones of Great River Associates to discuss the Riverdowns West Subdivision sewer project and the road improvements in the Stonehollow Subdivision.

Spencer Jones reviewed the three componenents of the agreement. The first section is to prepare a scope of services, and to determine the cost to operate and maintain the treatment plant and a payment schedule for the 20 year term of the bonds. The cost for the first section is \$ 1,500.00.

The second section is for the preparation of documents including bid specifications and all the paper work for prevailing wage requirements. Phase two will be approximately \$ 12,500.00. Phase three will provide construction oversight of the contractors for compliance with material certifications and to meet all building specifications listed in the bidding process. The third phase of the contract is yet to be deteremined because construction has not begun but it will be billed on an hourly basis.

Ray Weter asked is there a track record for Frontier in Missouri.

Spencer Jones replied theyhave experience in Rolla:

Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News asked what is the \$ 12,000 go for?

Spencer Jones replied that the \$ 12,000.00 would cover the preliminary work to prepare the bid, specificiations, contract agreement, prevailing wage, prebid conference, and to get a contractor on board.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett and Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia expressed their appreciation to Spencer Jones for the work they do for the county.

The meeting continued with discussion about the Neighborhood Improvement District regarding Stonehollow Subdivision road reconstruction.

Carson Elliff said that the originial bids for this project was significantly less than the recent bids. The initial lowest bid was \$65,000.00 and the recent bids are \$235,000.00. County Counselor John Housley stated that the homeowners could save approximately 25% if the road work was done privately without the County's assistance. On any county project the county is required to pay prevailing wage which is high.

Chad Zickefoose asked does the county have to have the reserves?

Carson Elliff responded that the money is available as to not leave the county hanging.

County Counselor John Housley said if there is a default the County has to pick up the bill and the reserve fund is there for the the County's protection to move forward with the NID.

One of the homeowners asked about the small window to prepay without interest.

Carson Elliff said that is correct in the beginning there is a small amount of time whereby a homeowner can prepay and be excluded from all accured interest. However, you are required to pay the full amount and no interest.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell had concern for the Sheriff using his personal car for work. The Auditor spoke with the IRS. The IRS said there are two kinds of plans, accountable and unaccountable. John Truman said law enforcement is allowed an abatement by IRS. They allow user to be compensated for fuel expense. Tom Lawson said most companies in the long run choose not to participate. The County Commission met with Bob Rubino for a discussion regarding Highway 14 located in Christian County. Bob Rubino presented a presentation showing the economic impact on the county. Missouri gets \$.17 cents for gas and diesel. They get sales tax in the amount of 4.225% and have 33,681 miles. This brings \$49,977.00 per mile. The states surrounding Missouri receive more money. Sales tax is the lowest in Mo. than all surrounding states. There are 44,000 vehicles per day cross the 14 and 160 intersection. The negative problems with improving 14 highway are the sinkholes. There are 65.3% of christian county residents work outside the county. Springfield has a city wide sales tax of 1/8 cents directed strictly for highways. They cost share with the highway dept. He presented some examples and current projects that Springfield is working on. If you cost/share, things get moved up on the priority list. He presented the actual ballot language to put a sales tax for highways on the ballot. State Statute 94.705 is for cities. He referenced transportation development district (TDD) statute 238.236. It allows a real estate personal property tax up to 10% or a sales tax up to Icent. Steve Childers ask if any other county has done this? Bob Rubino said yes, a multiple group of counties got together and did this. It is not controlled by the county commission, but by a Board of Governors and approval must come from MODOT. Commissioner Weter said a TDD tax is in leu of taxes in 238.235. Is this a revenue swap? Bob said no, 94.705 addresses cities and since 2005 TDD was introduced letting counties set up Sales tax is no longer allowed. Robert Palmer said this is putting more tax burden on the people with the eastern side of the county receiving no benefit. We need something to create businesses that succeed and are convienient to get into. Bob Rubino suggested that 14 highway has the biggest potential for developing retail. Robert Palmer said in talking to businesses nothing has been mentioned about lack of roads. Bob Rubino said Chase Card wanted to put in at CC and backed off because of the road.

Commissioner Weter ask if we could develop the board and form a TDD district but not take any action. Bob Rubino said yes. He said Macon, Marion, Monroe and Shelby counties are covered by TDD. It requires a vote by the people. Steve Childers said most sales tax is collected by the Cities of Ozark and Nixa and that would not be a burden on residents. There was discussion regarding cost share with modot on the CC/65 corridor.

Mr Rubino presented pictures of highway 14, Lou's letter in the paper regarding MODOT owning 14 highway and an e-mail from the County Auditor, Sam Yarnell regarding the amount of sales tax the county brings in at this time. The other things that make a county work are good Schools.

Mr. Lapaglia said himself, Brian Bingle and Steve Childers are on the OTO board It takes everyone to make things happen and it needs be done collectively.

Mr. Weter said he was sorry to lose Chase from Christian County. The OTO is a great organization. Once

you start talking tax issues, you have big problems. Mr. Rubino ask what we can do to leverage. Mr Weter said to form a TDD board. Steve Childers said you have 7.9% now and other places like Walmart and Lowes utilize a TDD now and there tax is about 10%, stack another 1% on that? Mr. Barnett thanked Mr. Rubino for a lot of effort and a good presentation. He said good roads, schools and sheriff are all considered in a good community. Mr. Rubino brings somthing to the table to look at for the future.

Mr. Lapaglia said a 40% increase in population will effect the roads. The roads in the county are behind now because the county has taken about 6 1/2 million out the roads for General Revenue. The other part of the problem is the tax base is residential not commercial. We need to balance the tax base. Steve Eoff stated he has a lot of property and investments along 14 highway and it is all ready for expansion but there is too much traffic for development to happen. Mr. Lapaglia agreed with Mr Eoff about transportation being a problem and thanked him for his comments. He thanks Mr. Rubino for his presentation.

8:30 a.m. County Commission and County Counselor John Housely

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Shawn Barry with Great River Engineering, Tim Canter with Frontier Environmental Technology, Melvin Eakins with Great River Engineering, P & Z Administrator, Todd Weisehan, Jerry Kendall from DNR, the following homeowners of Riverdowns West Mike Burros, Richard Eddy, Doug Twigger, Lewis Davis and Assessor David Stokely.

The County Commission met with County Counselor John Housley and Attorney Carson Elliff to discuss the Riverdowns West treatment plant.

Carson Elliff stated that he understands we are here to discuss Great River being the Engineer for this project and the possibility of amending the contract.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said when Chad Zickefoose was here, he recommended Great River and the Commission approved. Great River will remain as the County Engineering firm. The reason the county took this on was Riverdowns could not go to anyone else. We need to get this going and get it done. John Housley has made a decision and signed a contract with Great River and gave them certain things to do. It is unfortunate that Frontier has had issues with Great River. If Frontier has an issue, Great River will sign a non-compete or whatever is needed. We need oversight to make sure the plans and specs are correct and the project is built correctly because in the end, we own it. If there are some proprietary issues we need to review and take care of.

Ray Weter asked has the construction of the plant been bid out?

Carson Eliff said that the homeowners will contract with the county to maintain improvements. Mike Burros stated that there is an increase in standards with the county owning. He has enrolled in the school and will be taught how to run the treatment plant. He is already involved in getting it started.

Carson Elliff has a problem with moving forward because they need plans and specs along with the assessment on file. Carson needs to know that this is ok so he can proceed. When we have the public hearing we can approve the plans and specs because DNR has some question as to who owns it. Carson says ownership is not an option, the county will own it for 20 years and at that time they will deed it back to the homeowners.

Melvin Eakins said they have to give a report to the Commission and let them know it is ready to bid.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said he had spoke with Great River and if Frontier did some of the September 27, 2012

work that they were supposed to do they will take care of their part. Frontier said he does not want to discuss the past or site inspections and he will show his preparation.

Assessor David Stokely asked about the assessment roles and if he needs to do due diligence.

Carson Elliff said he will give the Assessor the final assessment role.

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Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that he wants all to understand we will move this project forward.

Tim Canter with Frontier showed his plan for working with Great River and moving forward. He said his goal was to minimize costs and financial exposure to the County. He also wants to use this site as an example. He promised to be there from the beginning to the end. He estimates the grand total to be \$729,000.00. This amount does not include administrative costs and equipment replacement. The administrative costs should be a little over \$2.00 per month per family.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked if Frontier does this project the cost per home per month begins at thirty dollars a month and does not include the administrative costs but it does include inflation costs.

Carson Elliff said they estimated at the beginning that the homeowners would be having a cost of forty dollars a month and we are still in the ball park. We do realize there will be an increase in the homeowners' dues to cover the costs of maintenance and repairs

Melvin Eakins said he has a question regarding the rate of thirty to thirty five dollars a month. Will that amount cover the insurance, administrative costs, manholes and lines needed for the system? Will the homeowners association be responsible to collect the money and to have a reserve to handle any repairs? Most homeowners pay twenty to sixty dollars a month for sewer service.

Tim Cantor said that a study done by DNR shows that the Riverdowns West uses approximately 19,000 gallons a day from DNR This system has the capacity to handle up to 80,000 gallons a day.

Melvin Eakins suggested that we have one general contractor that has ultimate responsibility.

Mr. Cantor suggested having a sole source technology which would save costs.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that our go to guy will be Great River Associates. Melvin Eakins said that he and Mr. Cantor will go over the specifics and will bring it before the County Commission.

Melvin Eakins asked when you put in the cost for the replacement does that include labor.

Mr. Cantor said that it did include the labor and repair and replacement and it would be included in annual costs. He said he planned on making site visits six times a year for the first two years and after that two to three times a year.

Melvin Eakins said the County Commission will own the treatment plant and there needs to be a flow meter in place.

Carson Elliff said that the homeowners will be responsible for the individual billing.

Richard Eddy, President of the Riverdowns West Homeowners Association asked what the time line is and when the project will begin.

Melvin Eakins asked if the County is going to be the owner because the property is in the name of the homeowners.

Doug Twigger feels that we are moving backwards two steps we were looking at the end of September but

now how long will it be.

John Housley said we are on the right path. Melvin Eakins and Carson Elliff will get together and get all the specifics lined out and then pursue the public hearing in October and have the bids out and go with a single general contractor and get it out for bid by the end of October.

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Cheryl Mitchell, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News, Rance Burger of the Springfield Newsleader, and Chief Deputy Clerk Norma Ryan.

The County Commission met with Sheriff Joey Kyle and Chief Deputy Brian Cathey to discuss the use of his personal vehicle for county business.

Sheriff Joey Kyle said the County Auditor said that the mileage report must include the beginning and ending mileage and the specific places where the Sheriff's mileage is used to comply with state statutes. The Sheriff said State Statutes requires the first \$ 50,000.00 of civil service fees be given to the county treasury that is then transerred back into the Sheriff's budget for operating expenses. He anticipates approximately \$ 120,000.00 in Civil Service Process fees next year. The Sheriff proposed to the County Commission that the \$ 50,000.00 that is given to the county beginning January 1, 2013, be given to the Shreriff to purchase his vehicle and one more vehicle to be used by a deputy.

In the past all the Sheriff's vehicles have been purchased by Federal Forteture Funds and those moneys cannot be used to supplement the cost of the county operations.

The Sheriff said that for the remainder of the 2012 year he will use his personal vehicle and reimbursed at .55.5 per mile.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said are you going to issue your vehicle to another officer and you purchase another car?

The Sheriff said that state statutes states that the Sheriff can use his own personal vehicle if there is no other car available for the Sheriff to drive.

Chief Deputy Norma Ryan asked does the list of dates, beginning and ending mileage reading and the specific place where the Sherifff went be noted on the reimbursement form.

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Richard Eddy, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News, Doug Twigger, Assessor David Stokely, Charlie Dennison, and Planning and Zoning Director Todd Wiesehan.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia, Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter and County Counselor John Housley met with Spencer Jones and Melvin Eakins of Great River Associates for an update on the Riverdowns West treatment plant.

Melvin Eakins said what we want to do is go over the findings and how to move forward and review the reports from DNR and the construction permit that is scheduled to expire November 30. The current permit is issued to the Riverdowns Homeowners Association and should be changed to Christian County. The permit must be extended and the extension justified. The ownership and the responsibility of the existing treatment plant will transfer to the County. In order to transfer the ownership there will be paperwork to complete, sewer rates to be determined and prepare a bid notice unless Frontier shall be considered a sole source vendor. There are questions if 80,000 gallons of waste water flow through this system. Then we can move forward to phase 2.

Currently, the construction permit is in the name of the homeowners' name. Great River Associates will contact DNR and proceed with getting the construction permit extended and transfer the name from the homeowners association to the county. They will also prepare the bid notice for the newspaper.

County Counselor Housley clarified that the construction permit is not an operational permit for the current treatment facility. He said that the current treatment plant is titled to the homeowners and will continue.

Attorney Carson Elliff affirmed that the county and all present are in agreement that the county will take over the construction permit. Then the County has agreed to run the plant for twenty years and then it will be turned over to the homeowner.

Spencer Jones said there are some known deficiencies by Great River but we need to know what is underground as well as what is on top of the soil.

Melvin Eakins would like to know as much as possible to have control over everything.

Spencer Jones said if the county owns the plant a meter will be installed and the homeowners will billed which puts the risk on the homeowners. There will be peaks in the discharge due to an increase of water to the collection system and the homeowners will see an increase in their bill.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said it is important that what is underground is known prior to the construction of the plant.

Carson Elliff said if there is a major problem with the collection system the homeowners and the Commission will need to reevaluate. He thought the County would have control of the collections and would feel uncomfortable without knowing everything such as the cleaning and replacing pipes, man holes and rainwater flow.

Spencer Jones said there were video's done at the site showing the rain water runoff and the deficiencies. The deficencies need to be addressed prior to the County taking ownership of the project.

Carson Elliff asked had the easements been transferred to the county for the county to obtain the collections.

Spencer Jones said the easements have not been transferred to the county.

Melvin Eakins said what they would propose to sign off on the plans and prepare the bid documents and do the administration of the construction contract to ensure everything is in place.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we will leave it to Great River to settle the particulars with Frontier but he wants it in writing of who is responsible to keep the plant functioning

John Housley said this is a unique situation and he is more in favor of bidding the project as a sole source since this will be a long term relationship.

Carson Elliff said he feels that Frontier will be involved for a long term agreement.

Melvin Eakins said that the sole source would be the easiest and the construction permit is specific to this type of plant.

John Housley said if there are unique plans and specs and he will rely on the engineers to determine if this is a sole source product. However, that will not guarantee the lowest bid and let the homeowners know.

Carson Elliff said that we have plans and specs that are approved by DNR and theoretically there is no other technology.

Spencer Jones said that Frontier would be the engineer of record for this project.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said what if there is a treatment plant in Arkansas and the county could purchase a treatment plant cheaper than build one?

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked if we do put this out for bid Frontier is willing to sell the technology?

Melvin Eakins said the General Contractor will lead the construction and Frontier would be a sub to the General Contractor.

Spencer Jones said he will get the construction permit extended and prepare the title transfer paperwork with DNR prior to the October 31, 2012 deadline.

9:00 a.m. Trevor Croley and Karla Scheib and Jeff Kennedy of Cox Health Plans Re: 2013 Cox Health Insurance Proposal

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples and Chief Deputy Payroll Clerk Tom Lawson and arriving later in the meeting was County Auditor Sam Yarnell, County Counselor John Housley, Todd Wiesehan Planning and Zoning Administrator and Attorney Carson Elliff.

The County Commission met with Jeff Kennedy from Cox Health Plans and Trevor Croley and Karla Albrecht of Croley Insurance for a presentation of the 2013 health insurance proposal from Cox Health Plans.

Mr. Kennedy said that 2013 Cox Health care plan is showing a twelve percent increase for the health insurance premium for the county.

October 15, 2012

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said you need to go to the underwriter's and ask to reduce the 12 percent increase.

Trevor Croley said that our costs were high for 2012.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter reviewed the analysis presented by Mr. Kennedy and noted that the County exceeded their costs by three percent more than what Cox Health plans brought in. Commissioner Weter asked was the increase due to utilization of tests?

Mr. Kennedy said services and tests combined increased the costs.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the current monthly cost per employee for the base coverage is \$ 251.00 and a 12 percent increase would result in a monthly premium of \$ 271.00. The 5 percent raise the employees recently received would not cover the cost and those employees with dependent coverage would especially feel the increase in premiums.

Trevor Croley said we have the base plan and two buy up options. There was discussion about no longer providing insurance and Trevor replied that if you don't provide health insurance there would be many people that would not purchase insurance.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell said you can't tweak the numbers they are what they are.

Tom Lawson said the county is paying the \$ 251.00 a month for every employee but what if there is a group of 40 that choose not to enroll in the health insurance. Mr. Lawson posed the question, why do some of the employees receive this benefit and others get nothing. Mr. Lawson suggested that the county move away from providing 100% of the health insurance at no cost for the employees and give them an increase to cover the cost of the insurance. As an employer, the cost of health insurance continues to increase and there will be a time when you won't be able to cover the premium costs.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said are you saying that we give everyone a raise to cover the insurance cost for one time and after that they would be responsible to make the decision to purchase health care coverage.

Tom Lawson said this would be a one-time increase.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said there are already companies that are scheduling employees for 28 hours a week to avoid paying insurance costs.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we will continue this meeting until the County Commission hears from Jeff Kennedy for a reduced rate on the monthly premium.

10:00 a.m. Christian County Commission Re: Bid Opening N.I.D. Stonehollow Subdivision

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, County Counselor John Housley, Attorney Carson Elliff, Todd Wiesehan Planning and Zoning Administrator and the following homeowners: Ethel Beyer, John Beyer, Tracy Wagner, Cleve and Florrie Walker, Jr., Darcy Pohlmann, Thomas and Judith Howard.

The County Commission opened bids for the Stonehollow Subdivision N.I.D. order for the bidding process Carson Elliff said the statute states that we have to have a public hearing and the bids that were previously bid were too high. We need easements signed by the homeowners, an approved assessment roll and the financing to be bid.

The project will be approximately \$235,000.00. There may be additional costs and that is built into the project. The newspaper notice states the bid opening for the Stonehollow project is set for November 8, 2012.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said after the road project is completed the Selmore Special Road District will do the inspection and the homeowners will need a letter from the Selmore Special Road District that the road was inspected and Selmore Special Road District will continue the road maintenance so that Stonehollow will no longer be responsible.

The material disposal was discussed as to where it is dumped.

Darcy Pohlmann said a homeowner would like to have the waste material dumped in their yard as fill which would save some money.

Childers, Ozark City Mayor Shane Nelson, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner, Assessor David Stokely, County Auditor Sam Yarnell and Rance Burger of the Springfield Newsleader.

The Christian County Commission met with Steve Childers, the City of Ozark Administrator to discuss the 2013 sales tax funding.

Steve Childers presented an order that was passed by the Ozark Board of Alderman for the continuation of the sales tax revenue for the roads. He made a formal request to continue the intergovernmental agreement to receive the county wide road and bridge improvements tax for the City of Ozark through 2012. He asked if this has been included in the county's 2013 budget.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we are working on the budget and it won't be laid down until December.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said to Steve Childers that Ozark has two funding streams.

Steve Childers said they do not have a tax for the roads or streets.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked Mr. Childers what do you project to receive from the sales 150 and 160 thousand which is determined by the miles of road.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said Highlandville and Saddlebrooke have requested to be part of the flock that is receiving funding from the road tax.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked what are the additional financial obligations for the county.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we have expenses of \$800,000 to a million and it will nearly double by January 1, 2013. There will be a reduction of sales taxes due to no tax on vehicles, the FEMA shelter, Highway CC corridor for \$950,000, \$957,000.00 for a F5 tornado shelter and the detention center. All of these numbers are confirmed by the County Auditor. When we go first class we will lose another \$500,000 of the Collector's revenue. The parcel number will decrease and the County will have to infuse funds to the Assessor's budget, salary increases, a full time highway engineer and there are many additional expenditures expenses increasing.

Steve Childers said we are anticipating an increase in expenses. Appreciate that the County Commission is looking down the road and planning for the future.

We have to continue to work on getting more businesses to the County and the cities and it is difficult to pull commerce as a bedroom community. We have asked that the meetings continue and that we need to increase the five and ten year plan and continue to put safety issues first.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said if a project came up tomorrow we don't have the fifty percent to participate. When we discussed the Cheyenne and Hwy. 14 project with MODOT said the matching funds could increase due to the lack of funding from the federal government. Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we are going first class and we don't know if CART funds will remain or if they will decrease and we have to come up with revenue to cover an additional \$800,000.00.

Shane Nelson said he knows that everyone is in the same boat. We will be forced to go for a tax and we will be battling each other to get the tax. He suggested over the next five years decrease the funding by twenty percent decrease until it is completely phased out. I know that you are in a tough decision and what can we do to work together. If our roads fall apart there will be less people that want to shop in the cities.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we don't have the time; last April we gave you six months to prepare. We don't have the time; there is no other revenue stream short of putting a property tax on the rural

citizens. It's timing, and if this would have started in the good times we wouldn't be suffering from equipment that is broken. The county runs on three million dollars and we are behind and are trying to work together and work with the economic forum. I wish there was an easy answer.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said he was not in favor of withholding the money. The tax was passed by the citizens and we have to cut back. You don't have the money. We are supposed to work together and he has not changed his opinion. You can change the ballot language and put it before the people. There are a lot of options on the table but we don't want to see the County divided.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia addressed Western Commissioner Bill Barnett to give them an answer as to where the \$800,000.00 will come from. We may have to refrain from purchasing a FEMA building.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we have some hard costs from \$ 800,000 to a million dollars and we are thinking and planning for next year. We have to plan with the numbers we have and when we put those numbers against the revenues they don't balance.

Shane Nelson asked will Highlandville and Saddlebrooke be included in the sales tax transfer. Are we to receive the road tax but not the sales tax?

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we are currently focusing on the expenditures for 2013.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said there will be two additional participants for the road and bridge tax funds.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said that we want to keep the road tax going to the cities and the roads. But

Steve wanted to present an intergovernmental agreement for 2013 and continue to work together with the same terms as we had this year.

Lou said the one Christian County is still there.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia suggested that Western Commissioner Bill Barnett get with the County Auditor to pursue funding for the upcoming expenditures of \$800,000 to a million.

Mayor Nelson agreed with Western Commissioner Bill Barnett that the people passed the tax and if our roads deteriorate it will cost the county.

Mayor Nelson said he doesn't take any of the conversation personally and I don't feel that 1 Christian County is waning. Just remember us as one of the main components in the county.

10:10 a.m. Spencer Jones - Great River Associates Re: Road Survey Discussion

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News, Rance Burger of the Springfield News leader and Melvin Eakins and Spencer Jones of Great River Associates.

The Christian County Commission met with Spencer Jones and Melvin Eakins of Great River Associates to discuss the road surveys. Spencer Jones presented an updated map of the road survey of the mileage contained in Special Road District.

Mr. Jones said there are two parts to the equation for funding; the assessed valuation and the mileage of

roads throughout the county.

Mr. Jones defined the highway funds that the revenues are provided through the motor vehicle drivers' licenses, fuel tax, and sales tax on motor vehicle. Currently, 18.4 cents goes to federal government and 17 cents goes to the state and the state distributes 2 cents per gallon from the fuel tax. For 2012, the gas usage has decreased.

Spencer Jones distributed maps to the roads to update the number of miles in the county. The mileage that is currently certified to the state for Christian County is 730 miles. After the survey, Mr. Jones reported the county has 913 miles which will is an approximate increase of 25% that will be reported to MODOT for funding.

Spencer Jones requested approval of the County Commission of the new maps to be presented to MODOT. The total mileage for the county is 913 miles.

Motion/Vote - Approve the County Road Mileage Survey

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter made a motion to approve the new assessment of the mileage of 913 miles for the county. Bill Barnett seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Lou Lapaglia (Yes), Bill Barnett (Yes), Ray Weter (Yes). The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headlilner News, Rance Burger of the Springfield Newsleader and Melvin Eakins and Spencer Jones of Great River Associaties.

10:45 a.m. Spencer Jones - Great River Associaties Re: Riverdowns West Sewer Collection System

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News, President of the Riverdowns West Subdivision Richard Eddy, Rance Burger of the Springfield Newsleader, Bond Attorney Carson Elliff, Homeowners: Doug Twigger, Lou Davis, Mike Burros and Todd Wiesehan Planning and Zoning Administrator.

The Christian County Commission met with Melvin Eakins and Spencer Jones of Great River Associates to discuss the Riverdowns West Sewer Collection System.

Melvin Eakins said we were asked to do a presentation of the run-off water. There was good information provided by the City of Springfield done by a video recording of the water run-off, the sewer lines, and the manhole inspections. We reviewed the videos and reviewed the manholes and the lines and prepared tables outlining the deficiencies they found. They repairs were divided by critical and less critical. There are four sections of piping that have significant sag in the pipe and those four sections of pipe need to be dug up and repaired and relaid. There are some cracking in the pipes and weakness that could cause the pipe to fail. The sewer should be laid straight and there are two places where there are two bends and two manholes to be placed where the bends are. There were two manholes that could not be inspected because there was no access. When the manhole lid attaches to the concrete it should be sealed and there are eight sections that need the casting reset to prevent rain water and debris and two below grade and one manhole has a hole in it and needs repair.

The system needs to be cleaned and to fix everything on the critical list would cost approximately \$ 125,000.00.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked, "Who's going to pay for this and could it be added to the project and will the budget allow it?

Carson Elliff said we can go 25% over the \$ 950,000.00, which includes the materials.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapagia said what do the homeowners feel about having this additional cost?

Mr. Eddy replied that the homeowners won't be happy with it but they know this has to be done correctly.

Carson Elliff recommended doing an amended petition to include the improvements discussed.

Spencer Jones said we will need to prepare new bids.

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Carson Elliff said we have to have another public hearing.

Bob Rubino said we want to see a solution for this problem and we don't the homes vacant.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said you don't want this leaking on your property.

Carson Elliff recommended that an amendment of \$ 1.2 million be done to cover the cost of the treatment plant.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked will the board be in agreement. What do we need to do to continue and to move forward?

Spencer Jones said we need to move forward with the bid package for the treatment plant.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia affirmed the bid amount of approximately 1.2 million dollars.

Carson Elliff said he would use whatever amount the Commission selects for the amendment. We will prepare the amended petition and present to the homeowners.

The Christian County Commission met with Brad Erwin of Paragon Architecture and G.R. Stovall and David Attkison from JE Dunn and Andy Pitts from Treanor (via telephone) to discuss the tornado safe room update.

Brad Erwin said that over the past few months he has worked with SEMA to obtain a grant from FEMA to obtain a tornado safe room for the county. This safe room would include space for additional purposes. The County has received approval from the application that was submitted in May, 2012. The County will go through the grant orientation and a letter to approve. The text of the grant document can't be changed once the project window is established. The safe room can be utilized by the public. The process will begin with preparing a schedule, do a basic site analysis, and space planning. The goal is to get drawings completed by the end of April and they must be submitted to Seam by October 1, 2013, to begin.

By phone, Andy Pitts said we are looking to the County Commission as to what you want us to do now.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this will give us a tornado shelter for an F-5 Tornado. The cost to build this structure is \$950,000.00 and the County's matching portion is \$237,500.00. This facility could hold 700 people.

Bill Barnett seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Lou Lapaglia (Yes), Bill Barnett (Yes), Ray Weter (Yes).

8:30 a.m. Sheriff Joey Kyle Re: Budget Discussion & Personnel

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Cheryl Mitchell and County Auditor Sam Yarnell .

The County Commission met with Sheriff Joey Kyle and Chief Deputy Brian Cathey to discuss the 2013 budget for his department.

Sheriff Joey Kyle presented his budget and said he is having difficulty with patrol officer's getting their reports done. There is a gap in the direct supervision of the deputies.

Chief Deputy Brian Cathey said he needs help to keep up with the supervision of the deputies and to watch the budget. He suggested creating a new position for another Chief Deputy to handle supervising the jail and oversee the deputies. Chief Deputy Brian Cathey would continue to handle the operations and investigations and the other Chief Deputy would be responsible for the administrative duties and the jail. Sheriff Kyle and Chief Deputy Brian Cathey proposed Deputy C.E. Wells to fill this position. Chief Deputy Brian Cathey said there are sufficient funds in the salary portion of the current budget and starting next year the new position would be included in the 2013 budget.

November 05, 2012

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked the Sheriff, with the additional six people, you are still running behind? What do you project for the revenues next year?

Chief Deputy Brian Cathey estimates an increase of federal inmates resulting in additional \$200,000.00 from the jail.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said so will C.E. Wells assume the new position?

Chief Deputy Brian Cathey said Mr. Wells was a former Sheriff in Webster County and has been in charge over two county jails. He will serve as an administrator/supervisor and also serve as a trainer for the deputies.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said, "Are we going to create a new position and what happens to the old position and who will take C.E.'s old position?

Sheriff Kyle said C.E.'s position will be filled by Danny Wells. The cost to the county will be additional \$ 55,000.00 including benefits.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the salary of \$ 55,000.00 does that include benefits or will it be an additional 32 percent?

Chief Deputy Brian Cathey said this wage includes the benefits for this position. He said C.E. Wells has years of experience with the jail and will improve the jail.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said, "You are sure that you can come up the money?"

Sheriff Kyle said that the cushion in the budget will be less but we will be able to cover the costs of this new position.

deputy position for the total compensation of \$ 55,000.00 which includes benefits.

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples and Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News.

The County Commission met with Brad Erwin of Paragon Architecture to discuss the FEMA Shelter .

Mr. Erwin presented a revised schedule for the FEMA Shelter. He said he had an appointment with SEMA for the grant orientation and to go through all the paper work. There was one thing that popped up when going through the procurement. Mr. Erwin said at any time a FEMA safe room is done the bid notice must include a request for qualifications for the safe room component.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter inquired about the 75 and 25 percent match and would the County be obligated for the 60 to 70 thousand. When we discussed the shelter alone, the County could incur the 25 percent match of \$ 237,000.00.

Brad Erwin said we have 9 months from design and 30 months to complete the project. At this time, the County would be obligated for design portion of 25 percent of \$180,000.00.

Brad Erwin said they may be able to devise a strategy.

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Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this is more than a safe building but an expansion for the Sheriff's Department.

Eastern Commission Ray Weter asked if we commit to the design phase does that obligate the County to the building phase.

Brad Erwin said the earliest you could bid this project is next year. He said the facility has specifics as to how the structure is built and a certain size for the building. The building comes with bathrooms and a generator.

Phil Amtower Emergency Management Director said if the county had a disaster like what Joplin experienced there would not be enough room to hold many people.

Julia Maples said after the building is completed it will have a value of three million dollars and the County portion is a little over \$200,000.00. The design cost is approximately \$45,000.00.

Prosecutor Amy Fite is covering the costs of everything except payroll out of her discretionary funds for the 2013 budget. Previously, the Prosecutor requested an additional assistant prosecutor for a salary of \$ 45,000.00 including benefits for a total approximate cost of \$ 58,500.00. The Prosecutor also discussed a prior budget hearing in October when it was discussed having the Sheriff and the Prosecutor share the cost of having a full time investigator. The Prosecutor was recently informed that the Chief Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs will be working 20 hours a week beginning February 1, 2012, but not in a supervisory position. The Prosecutor will need to hire an experienced attorney to fill the full time position of Donovan Dobbs.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter confirmed that Donovan will go to a part-time position for \$36,795.00.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett asked will Donovan eventually be leaving the county.

Prosecutor Amy Fite said he is interested in pursuing his ministry as a pastor.

Sheriff Joey Kyle said this is standard procedure for the Prosecutor to have an investigator that is in law enforcement

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the Prosecutor is requesting \$ 70,000 more from 2012 to 2013. Commissioner Lapaglia asked the Sheriff, could be pay for the investigator rather than funding the position through County Revenue. Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this would be a ten percent increase in your

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budget. The Sheriff, Commission and the Prosecutor discussed how the investigator would be paid, including the cost of supplies such as a car, fuel, laptop and training.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia suggested that the Sheriff transfer \$ 18,000.00 to the Prosecutor's budget and the full responsibility of the investigator would rest in one office to hire.

The Presiding Commissioner suggested to Sheriff Kyle to supply a car, gas and \$18,000.00 and the Sheriff agreed to the proposal.

Prosecutor Amy Fite said the county is getting more bang for your buck by decreasing operating expenses to allow for more staff. The County is getting one and half new attorneys and the additional staff will allow more cases through the system and the attorneys will be prepared to go to trial and more likely to plead guilty.



Lou ask where the funding is for the people that don't contribute? Tom showed where the money comes from . Since 2002 it has been taken to court, all courts say it is discriminitory but it is a law. Ray asked if there is a dollar amount that the county contributes to those people? Tom says there is but it is not distinguished as 4% for employees. There are two things to do to change this. The county can pay it for the employees or the law has to be changed. Lou asked if lagers is paid by the county? Tom said it is . Tom said he is here today to see if the Commission wants to change the form and pay the 4% for the employees or have it remain the same. The cost is \$6500 per pay period. \$179000 per year. Lou ask how many employees that are not getting the 4% taken out? Tom said 10-15. Ray asked if it was taxable. Tom said it is pre-tax. Tom said he is all for benefits but it should be a choice for the employee. Tom said in the CERF brochure, it tells how they calculate the benefits (minus the primary ss benefit), if you call them they can't explain how they get that formula. Several years ago CERF had been giving the wrong benefit to the employees. The first year CERF got a little over 3 million and now they get 9 million. Lou doesn't see any reason to change.



8:15 a.m. Sam Yarnell - Auditor Re: Budget Discussion

The meeting was attended by Commission secretary Julia Maples.

The Commission met with County Auditor Sam Yarnell to discuss various county budgets. The 1/2 cent sales tax will lessen the revenues of C1by \$212500and C2 by \$207690. The decision needs to be made how we are going to distribute the road and bridge tax. C1 and C2 will need to pull from this tax to balance what they had last year, It is important C1 and C2 will be able to draw from the balance that goes into the pool. Ray said one thing we can't do is take C1 and C2 losses .Ray said the current GIS has shifted some numbers and those things will change. If we don't change anything we will disperse funds to the special roads and C1 and C2 will fall short. The question is can C1 survive on \$212000 less than 2012? Lou looked at this Wednesday and if we don't take this money then we will need to look at payroll, Ray can't take the hit Bill said he is going to leave his like it is and let the cities and roads have the money. He will lower his budget and he will get by. Ray said the ideal thing would be able to go into this pot like the road and cities. Ray doesn't wan't to start short. He wants to take this money and backfill the budget and be a member of this pot in case we need the money. Can C1 take the backfill out of the pot without C2. Sam doesn't think you can do that. The cities and special road districts have their own sales tax, levies. Bill wants to discuss this with Ray before a decision is made. Sam discussed the actual budget. At this point, C1 has \$524,148.92 and C2 has \$582,877.24. There are 3 payrolls still to be made before year end. Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said the mileage of roads for all the special road districts and Common 1 and Common 2 has been changed based on the GIS mapping. The county spends approximately 115% of the CART funds received but the mileage revision will result in a decrease to 100%. The mileage of roads was sent to MODOT and the percentages will apply January 1, 2013.

MOTION/VOTE: Accept the Revised CART Distributions

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter made the motion to accept the new CART distribution based on the GIS maps presented by the County Auditor. Bill Barnett seconded the motion. The motion passed by vote: Bill Barnett (Yes), Lou Lapaglia (Yes) and Ray Weter (Yes).

County Auditor Sam Yarnell asked the Commission what was their decision regarding the remaining 1.2 cent sales tax that is currently distributed to the special road districts and the city's.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said we need to leave it the way and not change anything.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the smaller road districts suffer because they don't receive as much as the other districts.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said the size of the pie has shrunk but their are more pieces coming out of the pie. What that means to me, if we leave it like you want to leave it the same, C-1 that has a current budget of 1.1 million will be reduced to \$900,000. The east side of the county has more roads, rough terrain and needs to replace equipment. Richard and I are trying to prioritize what needs to be replaced.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said you are going to hurt but everyone else will get hurt to.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said he can't hurt that much and pick up the slack that has been left undone. He cannot begin the new year with a budget that is \$212,000.00 less than the prior year. He needs to place the \$212,000.00 back in the Common 1 budget to 2012 level.

PROPOSED MOTION: Change the Road Tax Distribution to Supply \$ 212,000.00 back to Common

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said his motion will be to take the shortfall from the road sales tax and backfill the budget for Common 1 Road District to the same amount of the 2012 budget. In addition, a third party will make the decision to prioritize all the road projects submitted by the other entities.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia agreed with Commissioner Weter that a third party such as engineers make the decision to prioritize the road projects.

Treasurer Karen Matthews are you only talking about the half cent sales tax. What has happened to the county revenue sales tax? Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said that after speaking to others at the MAC meeting there were as many that said it would not be reinstated from his conversations.

Treasurer Karen Matthews posed aother question; in August, the Common Road Districts could have set a levy. You are punishing her along with everyone that lives in a special road district. We vote to spend money and we have no money and that reduces the pot. You are getting your pot increased because you are getting more mileage and you get money from the National Forest. Here today no one was notified. There was no motion/vote posted on the agenda. You are not

Billings Mayor Bud Pierce with the City of Billings it is not fair you have already balanced your budget and so Common 1 and Common 2 Road Districts and all the other special road districts are getting the short end. They can't function with the levy and the CART funds they will fold. They have a third of the roads.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said even if you have a third party you will still have control over the money just like the Federal Government and you will have more needs. The road districts will fold without the money and the Commission will be spending more from the pool.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said every time we get together, there will likely be money spent, which is the nature of a budget and the Commissioners duty.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said those are wants not needs.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said he is not confident that he can meet the requirements by starting 2013 with a budget that is decreased by \$ 212,500.00 less than the previous year.

8:45 a.m.. Riverdowns West Amended Petition

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Tim Canter from Frontier, Richard Eddie, Planning and Zoning Administrator Todd Wiesehan, Melvin Eakins from Great River Associates Emerald and Linda Loyer, Ray Hasting, Mike Burros, Bob Rubino and Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News.

The County Commission met with Carson Elliff to discuss the amended petition for Riverdowns West Subdivision treatment plant.

Carson Elliff presented an amended petition of \$ 1.2 million for the Riverdowns West Subdivision treatment plant which includes an additional 25% for any cost overages. The amended petition was approved by 66 2/3 percent. The statutes state that if a project exceeds a million there can be an additional 25 percent for over runs.

Bob Rubion asked when is the start date for the project.

Melvin Eakins said when he gets approval to move forward the bids can be done in 45 days.

Tim Canter said DNR will not give a construction permit until there is a date set to begin the project.

Melvin Eakins said the permit expired Nov. 30, 2012.

Carson Elliff said we can file a proposed assessment, have a public hearing and order that the project begin but there is one problem that we are encountering, which is obtaining the easement on the properties to access the collection system. We can set a date but the financing must be established first.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked had anyone spoke with DNR since the permit expired.

Melvin Eakins said that they have asked for an extenstion but DNR has not responded.

Mr. Eddie asked how will the easements be done.

Melvin Eakins siad there are temporary easements and permit easments that we have to obtain but we can't do it until it is surveyed and the sewer lines are determined before digging.

Carson Elliff said you are probably wondering what will happen if the people don't sign off on the easements.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said we have to have 100 percent participation.

Carson Elliff said you can do imminate domain to take control of any easement. Mr. Elliff said he doubts that they will obtain a hundred percent and this may have to be considered by the Commission.

Richard Eddy said we have to get the collection system repaired prior to the construction of the treatment plant.

Melvin Eakins said if it is that urgent, time and money can be saved if the bidding is done separately.

Richard Eddy said we can't wait 6 months for the collection system because it wont' last that long. Assessor Stokely explained to the County Commission that the ESRI is the licensing, operating system and software that makes the GIS work with the aerial photography. The GIS is very important for accuracy that is used in many county offices.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked the Assessor how is the cost divided and will his office be participating in the cost.

Assessor Stokely said it will be broken out the same as last year between the Assessor, Emergency Management and Planning and Zoning.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett and Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said the quote will include the blocks and there should be discount for both projects.

Brandon McClure said there are only two options for internet services which are Springnet and CenturyTel. Currently, the main internet connection is CenturyTel and the backup is Springnet. The County pays Springnet approximately \$ 1,275.00 per month for their service in addition to the cost of approximately \$ 300.00 a month for the main connection from Centurytel. If the County could make Springnet the main connection this which would add an additional \$ 400.00 a month for all the offices.

Collector Ted Nichols said the goal is to have all the offices on the same connection that splits into the different offices after it reaches the court house one will be on the same connection.

Recorder Kelly Hall said there are approximately five lines at \$51.00 per month that receive internet from CenturyTel for a total cost of approximately \$300.00 per month.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia and Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said they don't see where it is financially beneficial. Would it cut the cost for CenturyTel and would it be reliable and speedy.

Collector Ted Nichols is concerned that the credit cards require a lot of band width and the connection becomes so slow that it may not be able to process the card. He would like the reliability of the having a better internet connection.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia suggested that Recorder Kelly Hall and Brandon McClure do a cost comparison between Springnet and Centurytel.

The County Commission met with Sheriff Joey Kyle to discuss a lease agreement for a suburban .

Sheriff Joey Kyle presented two options for the lease agreement for the suburban. The first option is to buy the 2008 suburban that has 70,000 miles for approximately \$23,000.00. The second option is to continue the lease for 36 months for a total cost of \$39,000.00 to be submitted to County Counselor for his approval.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked the Sheriff, are we better off to buy it or lease it.

Sheriff Joey Kyle said he would prefer to buy the suburban but by leasing there are more vehicles available on the short term but it is the more expensive option. Sheriff Kyle is not certain how it would limit the department on how many vehicles they could purchase for the remainder of the year.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said he hates to pay finance charges.

Motion/Vote - Approve the Sheriff to Lease a Suburban for 36 Months.

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Common 1 Road District Supervisor Richard Teague, Common 2 Road District Supervisor Brent Young, Assessor David Stokely, Tom

Chudomelka, Andy Arndt, Treasurer Karen Matthews, Auditor Sam Yarnell, Ozark Special Road District Commissioner Scott Bilyeu, Donna Osborn of the Christian County Headliner News and Rance Burger of the Springfield Newsleader and arriving late was Sheriff Joey Kyle.

The County Commission met to discuss having a line item in the 2013 budget that would provide funding for a County Highway Engineer in preparation for the county moving to first class status January 1, 2015.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this is a continuance from the December 6th, 2012, meeting.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said we have paid Great River Associates \$ 171,500.00 in 2011 and 2012 for the CC Corridor project and will remain under contract until it is completed. Commissioner Weter discussed a letter he received from the Planning and Zoning Administrator Todd Wiesehan that states having a county engineer on staff could provide a cost savings or revenue in reference to storm water issues, road design and construction and could act as a third party review for environmental projects.

In reference to the letter, Commissioner Weter was not certain that a road engineer would have the expertise to cross over for planning and zoning projects.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia reaffirmed the purpose of this meeting is to place a line item in the 2013 budget to having funding available.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked the Treasurer if she had anything to add to this.

Treasurer Karen Matthews said we just keep spending money and when we go to first class we are not required to have a highway engineer. We keep adding line items to the budget and we shouldn't keep spending money. You previously made a motion to hire a third party to review county road projects. You may want to amend or rescind the motion.

County Auditor Sam Yarnell said the funding can come from where ever the Commission decides and there would be additional 35% for benefits if you were to hire an engineer.

Andy Arndt by having a highway engineer compared to a highway administrator, the County could save money on what is currently paid to Spencer Jones for engineering services. He wasn't in favor of leaving Spencer Jones out of everything that the County is involved with. He asked would the county have to hire a road engineer. Mr. Arndt applauded the County Commission for planning for the future and not waiting to 2015 to make this decision. He also said that he would not be opposed to the County having a tax increase due to higher operation costs.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said we are still in the discussion phase. The 2013 budget does not have a line item for a road engineer and the question is, should there be one.

Treasurer Karen Matthews repeated the words of Mr. Pierce, from the previous meeting held last week that he is paying sales taxes to the county and receives nothing. The Treasurer asked what would happen if the Commissioner were to hire an engineer and there is no funding. She said she has information that confirms the transfer of the county sales taxes but the Commission didn't review it. She asked what would happen if the sales taxes were put back on the ballot through the petition process.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this discussion is not to hire an engineer but to have the line item in the budget

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said the immediate concern is not having a line item with an amount listed and the budget must be laid down on Wednesday and I don't want to make a motion without the logistics. Commissioner Ray Weter said he would like to prepare for it in the third quarter of next year and

place in the 2014 budget.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said this is the right decision to postpone this decision until next year to know what the expenses for 2014 will be such as health care costs.

Purpose of the meeting is to begin to move forward with the Riverside Bridge Project.

On Sept 21, 2010, the Riverside Bridge was closed because the structural integrity of the bridge was questionable.

Riverside Inn was purchased by FEMA in spring of 2010 and the deed was transferred to Christian County with special compliance codes. Mr. Jones wants to relay there is still an opportunity to build a bridge in this area, and there are many avenues that can be explored to aid this projects including legislation.

Most cost effective alternative would be building on or close to existing bridge, or other more costly

alternatives including moving the road and building in another location, although, this would require acquisition of property and easements.

Per Missouri State Statue 233.115, Ozark Special Road District has Jurisdictional control over this bridge and will be the party responsible for the project. Organizations to be involved in the project including the Ozark Special Road District, the City of Ozark, and Christian County. Mr. Jones proposed the parties involved may elect to enter into an inter-governmental agreement as the first step of moving this project forward. After an agreement is reached, then information may be submitted for FEMA/SEMA to utilize the Riverside Inn property for approval, then the timeline may be created for the project's completion including studies on the impacts on floodplain, establishing horizontal and vertical alignment for road and bridge, and preparing construction cost.

The Ozark Road District said they are excited to move forward with this project, and the County Commission said they are glad to help in any way they can, and the Mayor of Ozark says that they must speak with the city council, but with the council's approval they hope to contribute also.

County Council interjected that the county's CART funds may not be contributed for this project for cost sharing with the City of Ozark and Ozark Special Road District for this project.

Questions arose about being able to repair the historic bridge for use but previous studies done on the bridge prevent the use of the bridge to automobile traffic. Also, any of the previous studies done on the bridge and surrounding area will be available for use during the project in the future but new studies will be needed when the project gets underway. Also, a proposal to keep the old Riverside Bridge for foot and bike traffic was interjected.

Concerns are also voiced about access to emergency and other services that currently cannot cross the Finley River at this access point; and that vital sales tax monies may be being lost because of the difficult access to the City of Ozark.

Concerns also arose about funding the bridge project, in reference to the sales tax issue from past meetings, and the contributions that will be made from each party. Mr. Jones suggested talking about these issues at a meeting of the parties regarding sharing cost in the project.

Overall goal is to get the bridge open to the public.

Ozark Special Road District will be the party responsible for this project and will arrange a meeting for all parties in the future.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("IGA") FOR CART

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("IGA"), made and entered into second class county of the State of Missouri, acting by and through its County Commission (hereinafter referred to as "County") and the Stoneshire, Selmore, Billings, Ozark, Sparta and Garrison Special Road Districts individually organized, pursuant to Missouri Revised Statutes, Section 233.170 (hereinafter referred to as "Special Road District"), for the purpose of the improvement and maintenance of the County's network of roads.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Christian County receives County Aid road Trust Funds ("CART") from the State of Missouri on a monthly basis which is its apportionment of motor vehicle fuel tax revenues mandated by Article IV, Section 30(a)(1), Missouri Constitution, and Section 231.441, RSMO' and Section 50.550 RSMO' and

WHEREAS, CART funds credited to Christian County are required to be used by the County solely for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repairs of roads in Christian County per Article IV, Section

30(a)(1), Missouri Constitution, and Section 231.441, RSMO; and Section 50.550 RSMO; and

WHEREAS, Article VI. Section 16 of the Missouri Constitution and Missouri Revised Statute Section 70.220, authorized any municipality, special road districts, or county to contract and cooperate with other political subdivision of this state for the planning, development, construction, acquisition or operation of any public improvement or facility or common service and this IGA represents an excellent opportunity for the County and the Special Road District to work cooperatively for the common good of improving the network of roads in Christian county to facilitate economic activity, public safety, emergency response and the quality of life of their citizens; and

WHEREAS, it would be to the benefit of the special road district in Christian County for the County to distribute a portion of the County's CART funds to the special road districts in accordance with the funding formula set forth in the County Commission's Order of December 20th, 2012; and

WHEREAS, Special Road District has agreed that it will utilize the CART fund revenues distributed to it by the County for the exclusive purpose of constructing, reconstructing, maintaining and repairing those roads within its jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein set forth, the County and Special Road District agree as follows:

- 1. The County agrees to distribute to the Special Road District on a monthly basis, a portion of the CART funds that the County receives, in accordance with the percentage attributable to said Special Road District as described in the County Commission's Order dated December 20th, 2012, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be for the term of one (1) year and commence on the date of execution by authorized officials for the County and the Special Road District. This Agreement may be terminated by either party for cause upon thirty (30) days written notice. Just cause for termination shall consist of non-compliance with the provision of this Agreement or a violation of any state, federal or county regulation.
- Use of County Revenue. The Special Road District agree to expend all CART fund revenues
 received from the County pursuant to this Agreement exclusively for the costs of labor and
 materials expended on the construction or maintenance of roads in the Special Road District's
 jurisdiction.
- 4. General Independent Contractor Clause. The County and the Special Road District who are parties to this Agreement are each separate and independent political subdivision of the state and, as such, the County and the Special Road District each retain their own identity and each is responsible for its own policies and activities. This Agreement shall not be construed as creating a joint venture between the County or the Special Road District.
- 5. Accounting and Access to Records. The Special Road District shall provide written documentation to the County identifying the specific roads CART funds received pursuant to this Agreement were expended upon and shall maintain all records relating to the receipts and expenditures of CART funds by Special Road District pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, invoices, receipts, payrolls, bank statements, contract documentation and other records, sufficient to verify the CART funds were expended by the Special Road District exclusively for road construction, maintenance, or repairs of the roads within the Special Road District's jurisdiction. The road project descriptions and accounting records shall be supplied to the County Auditor, at no charge on a quarterly basis during the period of this Agreement. The first report shall be due April 1, 2013. The

Special Road District shall also provide the County Auditor any other financial records or documentation as deemed necessary to verify that the CART funds disbursed by the County to Special Road District have been spent exclusively for road construction, maintenance or repairs.

6. Miscellaneous.

- a. The Special Road District agrees to pass such ordinances as may be necessary to implement the terms and conditions of this IGA.
- b. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between the parties and fully supersedes any and all prior and/or other contemporaneous agreements or understandings between the parties which pertain to the subject matter hereof.
- c. This Agreement may only be modified by a written instrument executed by the parties hereto.
- d. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same document.
- 7. Notices. All notices, demands, and approvals required under this Agreement may be personally delivered or sent by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed to the individuals identified in the heading of this IGA, or to their successors, at the addresses listed below:

ORDER OF THE CHRISTIAN COUNTY COMMISSION OZARK, MISSOURI

DATE: December 20, 2012

SUBJECT: Adoption of Policy and Rules for Distribution of County Aid Road Trust Fund Revenues

WHEREAS, Christian County receives County Aid Road Trust Funds ("CART") from the State of Missouri on a monthly basis which is its apportionment of motor vehicle fuel tax revenues mandated by Article IV, Section 30(a).1, Missouri Constitution (as Amended 1979); and

WHEREAS, CART Funds credited to Christian County are required to be used by the County solely for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repairs of roads and highways in Christian County per Article IV, Section 30)a)(1), Missouri Constitution, 231.441 RSMO and 50.550 RSMO; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly, pursuant to its constitutional prerogative, provided other provision and restriction in Section 231.441, RSMO., which provides: "The county court shall formulate by written regulations, rules and policies for the use of such funds which shall be kept on file by the county recorder for public inspection."

NOW THEREFORE, on this 20th day of December, 2012, at a meeting duly called of the Christian County Commission, after public notice, and in open session, upon motion made by Commissioner Ray Weter, seconded by Commissioner Bill Barnett, and concurred with Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia, the Christian County Commission did vote unanimously to adopt policies and rules for the distribution of County Aid Road Trust Fund Revenues.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Christian County Commission's rules and policies regarding the distribution of County Aid Road Trust Fund revenues are hereby adopted and enacted with the following provisions or as may be amended form time to time by subsequent Order of the Christian County Commission.

A. Policy Statement.

The County Commission of Christian County hereby declares it to be the policy of Christian County to expend County Aid Road Trust Fund revenues received by Christian County, hereinafter referred to as the "Revenues", for those projects involving the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repair of roads and highways within Christian County in such a manner as will provide, in the judgment of the Commission, the greatest benefit to the citizens of Christian County, Missouri.

B. Allocation of Revenues.

Subject to the Commission's discretion, the Commission intends to follow the following criteria and guidelines in the distribution of the Revenues:

- Fifteen percent (15%) of the CART Revenues received by Christian County shall be first deducted and dedicated for bridge construction by the County Commission and said revenues shall be deposited in the County's Bridge Fund.
- 2. The remaining eighty-five (85%) of the CART Revenues received by Christian County will be divided by the total number of miles of road in Christian County for which repair and maintenance responsibilities are within the jurisdiction of the county government, under Common Road I and Common Road II 's maintenance responsibilities and the sic (6) Special Benefit Assessment Road Districts in Christian County, namely:
- Billings Special Road District
- · Garrison Special Road District
- Ozark Special Road District
- Selmore Road District
- · Sparta Special Road District
- Stoneshire Special Road District
- 3. The distribution formula that shall be utilized to determine the amount of the CART revenue each of the entities described in subparagraph 2 shall receive shall be in accordance with the number of miles of road each entity is responsible for maintaining as set forth below:

C. Intergovernmental Agreements.

Section 231.441, RSMo. requires that CART funds be used specifically for construction, maintenance, and repairs of roads. To authorize the County Commission to make these distributions of Revenues to the special road districts, each special road district shall execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the County Commission stating that the CART Revenues distributed to them shall be expended in compliance with constitutional and statutory provisions and as intended by the County Commission exclusively for the construction, maintenance and repair of roads within their jurisdiction. The special road districts receiving CART revenues shall also provide the County Commission with quarterly accounting and adequate financial information as directed by the County Commission to ensure said road districts are expending the Revenues in compliance with state law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if any section, subsection, sentences, clause or phrase of this Order is for any reason held to be invalid, such decisions shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Order. The county Counselor hereby declares the County Commission would have adopted the Order at each section, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of a fact that any one or more sections, sentences clauses or phrases be declared invalid.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to the requirements of Section 231,441, RSMO, that one copy of this Order adopting these CART distribution regulations shall be filed with the Christian County Recorder of Deeds and shall be made available for public inspection.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED this Order shall be filed in the Office of the County Clerk of Christian County, Missouri, before 4:30 p.m. this date and this Order shall be in force and effective January 1, 2013.

Previously, the County Commission requested Mr. Pace to prepare a document for drug testing and alcohol misuse.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia called the meeting of the County Commission to order at 9:00 a.m. on December 26, 2012 at the County Commission Office. Attendance: Lou Lapaglia, Present: Bill Barnett, Present: Ray Weter, Present. County Clerk is taking the minutes.

9:00 a.m. Glenn Pace - Human Resources Re: Matrix and Drug Policy Revision
The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Chief Deputy Assessor Brenda Dicus,
Deputy Assessors Garrett Buckley and Barbara Stogner, Chief Payroll Deputy Tom Lawson, Prosecutor
Amy Fite and Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs and Collector Ted Nichols.

The County Commission met with Glen Pace, the human resource consultant for the county to discuss the matrix and drug policy revisions.

Mr. Pace said he has received a little bit of response from some of the office holders requesting that some of the people be moved into another category. Mr. Pace said that the matrix ranges that were submitted June 25th, 2012, were approved by the County Commission with the exception of an addition for Service Workers III. The multiple lists that were passed out December 20th, 2012, were based on current ranges. The final matrix which includes Category VI, Service Workers III, is the largest group across the nation and it doesn't relate how they perform but how they are paid according to the range.

Mr. Pace said the reward is through the pay range and he recommended that the Commission adopt the matrix including Category 6, Service Workers III, as approved in June 25, 2012.

Brenda Dicus spoke on behalf of Assessor David Stokely; there are two employees that should move to another area.

The Commission proceeded to the next agenda topic of the revised drug testing policy.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked Secretary Julia Maples what was her opinion of the revised drug policy.

Mrs. Maples said she reviewed the revised policy and approved.

Collector Ted Nichols reaffirmed that the random drug testing will be done on all employees that drive county vehicles as part of their regular duties and all other employees would be tested if there is a reasonable suspicion.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia called for a motion to adopt the revised drug policy for the employee manual.

Mr. Pace said recent statistics show the cost of dealing with drugs in the workplace is approximately \$200 billion in losses. In our area, methamphetamine is the leading cause of drug problems.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked if counseling is an effective solution.

Mr. Pace said counseling helps in ten percent of the cases and the underlying cause is better but there is a December 26, 2012 . 1

tendency to return to their old friends and fall back into drugs.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia expressed appreciation to Mr. Pace on behalf of the County Commission for his effort on the matrix and the revised drug policy.

9:30 a.m. Prosecutor Amy Fite Re: Reclassify Pay Status

The meeting was attended by Commission Secretary Julia Maples, Assistant Prosecutor Donovan Dobbs, and Glen Pace, Human Resource Consultant.

The County Commission met with Prosecutor Amy Fite to discuss a reclassification of a pay status on the matrix.

Prosecutor Amy Fite requested that the victims advocate positions for Laura Blansit and Lacey Burk be reclassified from an hourly position to a salaried position. Mrs. Fite said both ladies have a four -year degree, required knowledge of victims' rights based on the Missouri Constitution and the State Statutes, available by phone seven days a week to the victims, continued certification through MSU and are required to make decisions and use discretion with each victim and provide community outreach through various county events throughout the year.

Mrs. Fite said that during various times when the trials extend past 5:00 p.m. comp time is accrued and it would be beneficial from a supervisor's position to make these salary positions. They would still take time off for overtime but it would be easier to budget their time instead of being concerned to schedule time off for the comp hours earned in the same pay cycle.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia asked how this wage change would affect her office and what benefit does it give the county.

Prosecutor Amy Fite said one of the positions is grant driven. If the victim advocates were in a salaried positions and trials extended beyond 4:30 p.m. for three weeks then the time accrued could be taken at a later date. The salaried positions would provide more flexibility to the Prosecutor's office and would reduce the liability of overtime pay. This reclassification would be more conducive to the mission of the office.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia said the comp time needs to be used completely prior to transferring to a salary position.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked Mrs. Fite had she spoken with the employees about this change.

Prosecutor Fite said she has spoken with them and they would be in favor of having a salary position.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett asked how do you handle it now and will the grant that pays for one of the positions continue.

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Prosecutor Fite said the grant will continue for the one victim advocate. Currently, the victim advocates take time off for any comp time earned within the same pay period. The problem is there is work that needs to be done but is prohibited because they have to take comp time.

Western Commissioner Bill Barnett asked if the grant ends, would the county be responsible for their wages.

Prosecutor Amy Fite said when the grant is expired the county would be responsible for their wages . By having them on a salaried basis rather than an hourly rate it relieves the County's liability from accruing comp time.

Presiding Commissioner Lou Lapaglia called for a motion to have Lacey Burk and Laura Blansit transfer from an hourly to a salary position after all the comp time has been exhausted.

The County Commission met to review and approve the lease agreement with Joyce Lowther for the property located at 207 South 2nd Street in Ozark, MO.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE, made and entered into this 1st day of January 2013, by and between Christian County, Missouri, herein after referred to as "Landlord" and Joyce Lowther, hereinafter referred to as "Tenant" whether there be one tenant or more.

- 1. <u>Dwelling.</u> The Landlord does hereby rent to the Tenant the following described premises commonly known as: 207 S. 2nd Street, Ozark, MO. 65721
- Term of Lease. The initial term of this Lease shall be for twelve (12) months. The initial term shall commence on January 1, 2013, and shall terminated at 12:00 noon on December 31, 2013, provided, however, either Tenant or Landlord may cancel and terminated this Lease by giving sixty (60) days notice on the first day of the month.
- 3. Rent. The rent for the property shall be FOUR HUNDRE D AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$400.00) per month payable on or before the second Thursday of each and every month to Landlord. Should the rent not be paid when due, there shall be a Seven and No/100 Dollar (\$7.00) per day late charge to cover the costs of additional bookkeeping, collection, trips to the property, and other costs that are incurred. Such sums shall accrue on a daily basis and shall be considered for all purposes as additional rent on the property.
- 4. Occupancy and Use. The premises shall be used and occupied solely as a private dwelling by the above-named Tenant and his immediate family as listed on the application. No one shall be allowed to reside or live on the premises other than a minor child of the Tenant, unless they are the party to this Agreement. The premises shall be used solely for residential purposes and not for any commercial purposes whatsoever. Tenant agrees not to use or permit the use of the premises for unlawful or immoral purposes or use the premises in any manner that would be contrary to the local ordinances or codes, or cause the property to become uninsured or cause higher insurance rates to go into effect. Tenant agrees to keep the premises in a clean, sanitary, and good order and condition and agrees not to hamper, disturb, or interfere with any other person in the neighborhood nor create or suffer any nuisances on or about the premises affecting the right of others. Tenant

further agrees to comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and directions of governmental authorities. If Tenant shall fail to keep the property clean and orderly Landlord shall have the right to declare a breach of this Lease or many correct the conditions after first giving notice to Tenant. Any costs incurred by Landlord, after notice, shall be deemed rent and shall be due and payable on the first day of the next month.

It is hereby agreed that if Landlord in its own discretion elects to demolish or move the house during the term of the Lease, it may give notice to Tenant, and Tenant agrees to vacate the premises, within sixty (60) days of said notice.
- 7. <u>Damages to Premises</u>. Any damage to the premises done by the Tenant or any other party during the term of this Lease Agreement shall be reported to Landlord within twenty -four (24) hours. If the damages shall be caused by the Tenant or his guest then the Landlord shall have the option of requiring the Tenant to fix the damage or repairing the damage itself and charging such repairs to the Tenant. The County Commission met with the Village of Saddlebrooke to sign an intergovernmental agreement for building inspections. The County will perform building inspections for the Village of Saddlebrooke and will report all violations to the Village and they will take responsibility of all violations. The county is held harmless from all liability and the agreement has been reviewed by the County Counselor.

Donna Osborn of the Christian what does the agreement do for Christian County.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said the County will collect revenue from the inspections fees but are not authorized to enforce the code. The inspections are based on the ordinances of the Village of Saddlebrooke. Western Commissioner Bill Barnett said this agreement supplies a little revenue to help pay the salaries of the building inspectors.

Bob Rubino said he and Bill Barnett worked hard to get building codes for the county and he had concern

that the building codes were not the standard that the county follows.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter said the agreement follows the same procedures for the County and the City of Fremont Hills.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter entertained a motion for the Coiunty to enter into an agreement with the Village of Saddlebrooke for one year beginning January 1, 2013 to be in effect through December 31, 2013. This contract automatically renews for one year intervals but is required to be readdressed December 31, 2015.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this 27th day of December, 2012 by and between the Village of Saddlebrooke, MO (hereinafter referred to as "Village") and Christian County, MO (hereinafter referred to as "County").

WHEREAS, the Village request that the County provide inspection services for residential and commercial construction within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the County has a Building Code Department with inspectors and is agreeable to provide building code inspections for the Village; and

WHEREAS, the parties herein are authorized pursuant to section 50.332, RSMo, to enter into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS HEREINAFTER CONTAINED, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Services.</u> County agrees to provide the building inspection services for all phases of Construction, both residential and commercial, according to the ordinances presently adopted by the Village.
- 2. <u>Adoption of Building Codes.</u> The Village agrees to adopt an ordinance for a building code and regulations consistent with those building codes adopted by the County Commission under order 03-13-08-01 or any subsequent amendment thereto.
- 3. Permits. All building projects within the Village will be subject to the permitting requirements as described in County Commission order 03-13-08-01, Adoption of Building Codes and Regulations for Christian County. Any applicant seeking a construction permit within the shall first apply to the Village Clerk for a certificate to identify the property for which a construction permit will be sought to ensure the property is properly zoned for the construction anticipated and that the Village has approved its design and construction. This certificate will then be submitted to the County Building Inspection Department with the application for any building permit.
- 4. Fees. The Village agrees the County may charge a reasonable fee for building inspection services for inspections in the Village in accordance with the fee schedule adopted under County Commission order 03-13-08-01 or any subsequent amendment thereto. Each project to be inspected within the Village will be charged the appropriate building inspection fees per each person seeking a permit. All applicants for permits shall make the necessary deposit of funds for such inspection fees with the County, at or before the time of the permits issuance. No inspection will be provided by the County for any project until all fees have been collected

for that project.

- 5. Village Consent. The Village hereby authorizes the Christian County Building Inspections
 Department to charge all applicable fees, perform all required inspections and mandate all
 necessary corrections for any building projects within the Village for the purpose of enforcing
 minimum standards of construction to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of
 the Village.
 - 6. <u>Dangerous buildings.</u> This agreement does not grant authority, require, nor bind the County Inspections Department to charge all applicable fees, perform all required inspections or perform enforcement actions on dangerous or unsafe buildings as described in County Commission order 03-13-08-01.
 - 7. Flood Plain. This agreement does not grant authority or require the County Building Inspections Department to act as flood plain administrator, nor interpreter of the requirements of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) as it may apply to the Village. It will be the sole responsibility of the Village to notify the County Building Inspections Department whenever any building project will be located within a 'Special Flood Hazard Area' (SFHA), Special Hazard Area (SHA), Floodway, or any other area designated by the NFIP as requiring specific construction criteria for the purpose of achieving compliance with the NFIP, State of Emergency Management Agency, or any other entities. It will be the sole responsibility of the Village to provide all necessary information at the time a permit application is submitted, such as the Base Flood Elevation (BFE), Design Flood Elevation (DFE), any pertinent items such as any extra freeboard that may be required above the minimums set for the NFIP, and other required information. In return, the County Building Inspections Department will provide building inspection services in conformance with the International Code Council Family of Codes as it pertains to construction with SFHA's.
 - 8. <u>Prosecution of Violations.</u> The County agrees to report all violations noted by its inspectors and any corrective process. The County, however, shall not be obligated to prosecute any violation of the Village ordinances or regulations, which shall be the sole responsibility of the Village. In the event construction of any project within the Village proceeds in violation of any building code requirement, the Village may proceed with enforcement under the Village ordinances, zoning and/or building codes. The County agrees to provide any necessary witnesses for such prosecution.
 - 9. <u>Term.</u> The term of this agreement shall commence on January 1, 2013, and remain in effect until December 31, 2013. This agreement may be terminated by either party hereto upon thirty day written notice of termination to other party. Any renewal of the agreement after the initial term or any changes herein shall be by the order of the County Commission and an ordinance adopted by the Village.
 - 10. Waiver and Release. The Village agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Christian County, its elected officials, employees, agents and contractors against any and all claims, damages, injuries, and expenses, including attorney fees resulting, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, from the inspection services properly provided by the County Building Inspections Department pursuant to this agreement.
 - 11. <u>Indemnity.</u> To the extent not covered by sovereign immunity under Missouri law, the County hereby agrees to assume responsibility imposed by law on its officeholders and employees and the Village hereby agrees to assume responsibility for the liabilities imposed by law on its officials and employees. Each party to this agreement shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of services by the other party. This language is not intended

to act as a waiver or limitation of either the County's or the Village's rights and/or defenses with regard to sovereign immunity under federal law, Missouri law or municipal regulations.

12. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This agreement contains the entire understanding and agreement of the parties. There are no other promises or conditions. No modification, amendment, cancellation or waiver of any of the provisions of this agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing and is signed by a representative authorized by each party hereto.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 27th day of December, 2012 by and between the City of Fremont Hills, Missouri a fourth class city (hereinafter referred to as "City") and Christian County, Missouri a second class county (hereinafter referred to as "County").

WHEREAS, the City request that County provide inspection services for residential and commercial construction within the corporate city limits of said City; and

WHEREAS, the County has a building Code Department with inspectors and is agreeable to provide Building Code inspections for the City; and

WHEREAS, the parties herein are authorized pursuant to Section 50.332, RSMo, to enter into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERTATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENTNTS AND AGREEMENT CONTAINED, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Services.</u> Christian County agrees to provide Building Inspection services for all phases of construction, both commercial and residential, according to the ordinances presently adopted by the City of Fremont Hills.
- 2. <u>Adoption of Building Codes.</u> The City agrees to adopt an ordinance adopting Building Codes and Regulations consistent with those building codes adopted by the Christian County Commission under Christian County Commission order 03-13-08-01 or any subsequent amendment thereto.
- 3. <u>Permits.</u> All building projects within the incorporated areas of the City will be subject to the permitting requirements as described in Christian County Commission order 03-13-08-01, 'Adoption of Building Codes and Regulations for Christian County'. Any applicant seeking a permit for residential or Commercial construction within the incorporated areas of the City shall first apply to the City Clerk of Fremont Hills for a certificate to reflect that the property for which the construction permit is to apply is properly zoned for the construction anticipated, and that the City's Board has approved its design and construction. This certificate will in turn be submitted to the County Building Inspections Department with the application for the building permit.
- 4. <u>Fees.</u> The city agrees the County may charge its reasonable fees for building inspection services for inspections in the City in accordance with the Building Inspections Fee Schedule as adopted under Christian County Commission order 03-13-08-01 or subsequent amendment thereof. Each project to be inspected within the City will be charged the appropriate building inspection fees per each person seeking a permit. All applicants for permits shall make the necessary deposit of funds for such inspection fees with the County, at or before the time of the permit issuance. No inspection will be provided by the County for any project until all fees have been collected for that particular project.
- 5. <u>City Consent.</u> The City hereby authorizes the Christian County Building Inspections Department to charge all applicable fees, perform all required inspections and mandate all necessary corrections for any building projects within the City of Fremont Hills for the purpose of enforcing minimum standards of construction to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Fremont Hills.
- 6. <u>Dangerous Buildings.</u> This agreement does not grant authority, require, nor bind Christian County Building Inspections Department to perform inspections or perform enforcement actions on dangerous or unsafe buildings as described in Christian County order 03-13-08-01, 'Adoption

of Building Codes and Regulations for Christian County'.

7. Flood Plain. This agreement does not grant authority or require the Christian County Building Inspections Department to act as flood plain administrator, nor interpreter fo the requirements of The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) as it may apply to the City of Fremont Hills to notify the Christian County Building Inspections Department whenever any building project will be located with a 'Special Flood Hazard Area' (SFHA), "Special Hazard Area" (SHA), Floodway, or any other area designated by the NFIP as requiring specific construction criteria for the purpose of achieving compliance with NFIP, State Emergency Management Agency, Federal Emergency Management Agency, or any other entities.

It will be the sole responsibility of the City of Fremont Hills to provide all necessary information at the time a permit application is made for each building project such as the Base Flood Elevation (BFE), Design Flood Elevation (DFE), and any pertinent items such as extra freeboard requiring above the minimum as set for the NFIP, or any other required information. In return, the Christian County Building Inspections Department will provide building inspection services in conformance with the International Code Council Family of Codes as it pertains to construction with SFHA's.

- 8. <u>Prosecution of Violations</u>. The County agrees to report all violations noted by its inspectors and any corrective process. County, however, shall not be obligated to participate in or actually prosecute any violation of the City Ordinances or regulations which shall be the City's sole responsibility. In the event construction of any project within the incorporated area of the City of Fremont Hills proceeds in violation of any City Building Code requirement, the City Attorney for the City of Fremont Hills may proceed with enforcement under the City's Ordinances, Zoning Codes and/or Building Codes. The County agrees to provide any necessary witnesses for such prosecutions.
- 9. <u>Term.</u> The terms of this agreement shall commence on January 1, 2013 and shall remain in effect until December 31, 2013. This agreement may be terminated by either party hereto upon thirty (30) days' written notice of such termination to the other party. Any renewal of this agreement after the initial term or any changes herein shall be by the Order of the Christian County Commission and an ordinance adopted by the Board of Alderman of the city of Fremont Hills.
- 10. <u>Waiver and Release.</u> The City agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Christian County, its elected officials, employees, agents and contractors against any and all claims, damages, injuries and expenses, including attorney fees resulting, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, from the inspection services provided by the Christian County Building Inspections Department pursuant to this agreement.
- 11. <u>Indemnity.</u> To the extent not covered by sovereign immunity under Missouri law, the County hereby agrees to assume responsibility imposed by law on its officeholders and employees and the City hereby agrees to assume responsibility for the liabilities imposed by law on its officials and employees. Each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of services by the other party. This language is not intended to act as a waiver or limitation of either County's or City's rights and or defenses with regard to sovereign immunity under federal law, Missouri, or municipal regulations.
- 12. Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire understanding and agreement of the parties; there are no other promises or conditions. No modifications, amendment, cancellation or waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing and is signed by a representative authorized by each party hereto.

The County Commission met with Brandon McClure from PC Net to discuss an internet proposal for the County.

Mr. McClure recommended that the following offices: Recorder of Deeds, Collector of Revenue, County Clerk, Treasurer, Auditor, Public Administrator, Emergency Management and all other departments that are under the control of the County Commission have one main internet connection which would increase speed and reduce costs.

Currently, the offices referenced are using several different portals with internet speeds from 1.5 to 15 megabytes having Centurytel as the main connection and Springnet as the backup.

The cost of switching to Springnet as the main connection and Centurytel as the fail over connection was more expensive.

Recorder Kelly Hall suggested that by using the one connection for all the offices and staying with the current vendors the county would save approximately \$ 318.00 per month. The offices could do a monthly cost share with the Collector for the difference.

Eastern Commissioner Ray Weter asked are we seeking more reliability or more band width .

Brandon McClure said by having Springnet as the one main connection and Centurytel as the backup the cost would be approximately \$2,160.00 per month. He also suggested having Centurylink as the main connection and Springnet as the failover. He said there is a one-time license fee with Cisco for \$175.00.
